Word has been received here to the
effect Daniel Surface, of this city and
his daughter Mrs. Jessie Allee, of
Chicago, were guests at the Hotel
Clarendon Sea Breeze, Florida, which
was destroyed by fire Saturday night.
In a letter to The Palladium, Mr. Sur-
face writes: "My daughter and I lost
everything but our lives." Mr. Sur-
face is a former owner of The Palladi-
um and also was postmaster previous
to the appointment of Mr. Speck-
enhier.

Mr. Surface and his daughter had
been in Florida to spend the winter.
Before going Mr. Surface's health was
not very good. After being burned out
at Sea Breeze he and Mrs. Allee went
to the Prince George Hotel at
Daytona, Florida. They now are en-
route home.
