PRISON FOR LIFE; THEN 14 YEARS

Odd Verdict That Resulted in
A Chicago Criminal
Case.

FATE OF THREE BANDITS

Chicago, Ill., March 6.—Three bandits
today were held guilty by a jury in
Judge Kersten's court, and sentenced to
prison for life plus fourteen years. This
odd verdict resulted from conviction on
two charges. The bandits were found
guilty of robbery with a deadly weapon,
which carries a sentence for life and al-
so of robbery under the habitual crim-
inals act which prescribes fourteen
years imprisonment.
Judge Kersten declared it the oddest
verdict he ever heard of in all his years
of experience of criminal court work.
The men convicted are John Rud-
neck, Joseph Brocki and John Tierney.

TWENTY CONVICTS MAKE AN ESCAPE

Mexican Jail Delivery Releases
Desperadoes.

Mexico City, Mex., March 6.—News
has reached here that twenty long
time prisoners in the fortress of San
Diego at Acapulco made their escape
Wednesday night by digging out un-
der the walls and letting themselves
down into the water and swimming to
safety. Most of the convicts were
murderers and bandits and many were
in for life terms. The guards did not
discover the escape until daybreak.
None of the convicts has been re-
taken.
