Manila, March 31.—The news of the murder of Dr. William Jones, a prominent anthropologist, who was pursuing investigations for Field museum of natural history in Dumabato, reached here today. It is supposed that the atrocious deed is the work of hostile tribesmen.

There has recently been discovered in Buenos Aires a spider which practices fishing at times.
