SHE WANTS PENALTY

Ida G. Wadsworth Takes Action on a Fraudulent Marriage Case.

MAKES DEMAND FOR \$100

Proceedings have been instituted in the Wayne circuit court by the State on behalf of Ida G. Wadsworth vs. John H. Wadsworth to recover penalty for fraudulent marriage. The demand is made for \$100. A similar case was filed a short time ago, but withdrawn. It is claimed the defendant, John Wadsworth, married the plaintiff after marriage he failed to provide for her and deserted her. The statutes provide that a trial in which fraudulent marriage is alleged must be before a jury. If the defendant is convicted the minimum fine is \$200. For failure to pay the fine a term of imprisonment is provided. The Wadsworth's domestic relations have found vent in court but never as a trial proceeding.

HAS WARM WEATHER CAUSED DESERTION

Or Is It Just Plain Case of Mania?

Chicago, July 22.—Has the warm weather stirred a feeling of discontent and restlessness amongst husbands, or has a desertion mania infected this territory? This question is puzzling Municipal Judge John R. Newcomer and attaches of the Harrison street court, who for the past month have had a busy time with young and aged women complaining of abandonment by their husbands. "Since the first of June the wide abandonment cases have increased nearly 30 percent," said Clerk Gardner. "Nearly forty women have appeared at this court already since July 1 for warrants for their husbands. Last month the number reached more than seventy-five."
