Dutch artists were the first to make a practice of representing incidents of domestic life in the actual surroundings of the home as well as the occupations, pastimes, amusements and humors of everyday folk, both in prosperous and in humble circumstances. For this new kind of picture the French have furnished the name "genre" (pronounced zhonr). It is usual to call these subjects, whether painted by the Dutch or by other artists who have adopted the same subjects, as genre pictures, or, more definitely, as pictures of domestic genre, of peasant genre, or humorous or polite genre, and so on, according to their particular character.—Charles H. Caffin in St. Nicholas.
