Washington, Sept. 28.—How many candidates do you suppose there are for the presidential post offices in Indiana? Senator Beveridge and Representatives Crumpacker and Barnard could tell if they would. One thing certain is that there is no lack of them. Nearly every man who is in wants to stay in, and in every city and town there are outsiders who are certain they can give better service than the present incumbent. In the eleven districts represented by democrats the appointments will be made on the recommendation of the senator. In the Tenth district, Representative Crumpacker's O. K. is all that is required, and in the Sixth district all that is necessary is to have the support of Representative Barnard. From now on until congress meets in December the post office contest will wax warm, for many nominations must go in during the short session of congress.

TEN UNION PRINCIPLES.

Potters Adopt a Comprehensive List of Rules For Conduct.

Ten principles for union men have been made public by the International Brotherhood of Operative Potters for adoption by all members of national and international unions in the country. They are as follows:

"First.—Attend the meetings of the unions and be not tardy nor leave before adjournment. Your interests are at stake. See that they have your personal consideration.

"Second.—Take an active part in the meeting and regard yourself as the chief pillar of the union and the one without which the structure could not stand.

"Third.—Shake hands and welcome all the newly installed brothers and see to it that this service is continued until all are within the fold.

"Fourth.—Love thy brother as thyself and prove it by helping in cases of need. Cultivate feelings of mutual concern to the effect of securing employment one for the other.

"Fifth.—At all times insist on the union rate of wages and work within the limit of hours prescribed by the laws. In the doing of this you will improve the trade.

"Sixth.—Make an engagement to be present at all open meetings of the unions, that your social condition as well as your intellect may be improved.

"Seventh.—Leave thy prejudices and personal dislikes at the door and enter the union in the spirit of brotherly love and with a desire to serve humanity.

"Eighth.—Do thy part in the union faithfully and well before thou shalt deem thyself to judge another's lack.

"Ninth.—Consider thyself the advance agent of each coming meeting and bring to the same some thought that will prove instructive as well as profitable to the union.

"Tenth.—Regard thine own acts and character as the criterion by which the public will judge the unions. Remember its humane mission and strengthen it by flawless acts and dignified support."

SPANISH VICTORY IS NOW EXPECTED

Stronghold of the Riff Tribesmen Is Expected to Fall Any Time.

MADRID CRAZED WITH JOY

NEWS FROM THE FRONT CARRIED BY COURIERS THROUGHOUT THE KINGDOM, CAUSING NUMEROUS CELEBRATIONS.

Madrid, Sept. 28.—With the Moroccan stronghold at Mt. Gurugu completely surrounded on three sides by the Spanish army, the Standard of Spain set in the town of Nador and the Riff forces shattered from the heavy artillery fire, the fall of the Moorish base of operations and the complete surrender of the tribesmen is now expected momentarily.

The city of Madrid was mad with excitement today over the prospect of the end of the Moroccan war and the news was carried by couriers throughout Spain causing celebrations in various towns and cities. Following a captive balloon which soared high above the danger of the Riff sharpshooters the Spanish advance under Gen. Crozeo burned many towns about Nador which is on the road to Zeluan. The Moors made a night sortie but were driven back by artillery and sustained heavy losses. The residence of the tribesmen is thought to be doomed to disaster and already, it is reported today, articles of peace making heavy demand upon the tribesmen are being drawn up.

OPTION LAW GETS ANOTHER JOLTING

Motion to Quash Affidavit for Illegal Voting Has Been Filed.

RAISE SPICY QUESTIONS

IS ALLEGED THAT THE WHOLE OPTION ELECTION HELD IN MADISON COUNTY WAS AN ILLEGAL AFFAIR.

Anderson, Ind., Sept. 28.—Another rap at the Indiana local option law was taken in the circuit court, when Attorney Phil O'Neill filed a motion to quash the affidavit charging Fred J. Wischmeyer with illegal voting.

Mr. Wischmeyer lives at Pendleton, and was arrested on complaint of the "drys" on election day charged with casting an illegal vote. The claim was made he had not lived long enough in Pendleton to gain a legal residence.

The case is set for trial October 24, and will be heard at that time unless the court sustains the motion to quash the affidavit.

The Question Raised.

Interesting questions are raised in the motion to quash the affidavit, the most interesting of which is probably the one which sets up the claim that the whole option election was an illegal affair. It is alleged that if the charges made against Wischmeyer in the affidavit are true, they do not constitute a public offense in the sight of the law. Accepting the theory that Wischmeyer did vote or attempted to vote at the option election in Pendleton, the defense asserts he did not in any way transgress the Indiana election law. The law prescribes that who ever, not having the legal qualifications of a voter at any election authorized by law to be held in this state, for "any officer" votes or offers to vote at such election, shall be guilty of a violation of the election law. There was no "officer" voted for at the option election, the matter at issue at the polls simply being a question of "wet" or "dry" and the fact that Wischmeyer did not vote or attempt to vote for any "officer" is considered by his attorney sufficient ground for dismissing the affidavit.

An Illegal Election.

The question of the constitutionality of the option law is also raised and is likely to be threshed out. The broad ground is assumed in defense of Wischmeyer that the option election was an illegal one held under a law that is clearly unconstitutional so it is asserted and consequently any alleged technical violation of the laws governing Indiana elections would not apply to the option election. The issues raised by the motion to throw the Wischmeyer case out of court are interesting inasmuch as they bring up to the court in another form the question of the constitutionality of the local option law.

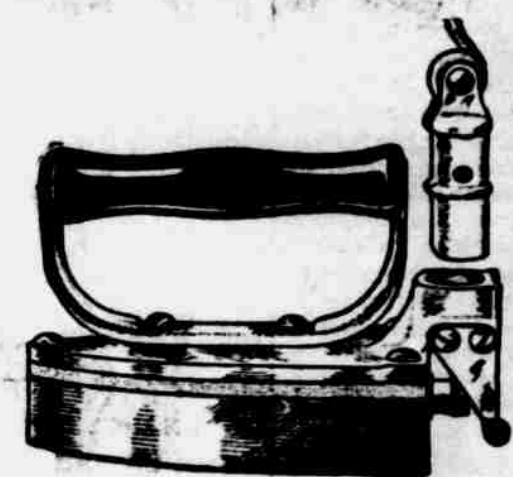
