A HALF MILLION KIDS IN PARADE

A Most Unique Spectacle Was Witnessed by Great New York Crowds.

WAS CELEBRATION EVENT

TONIGHT THE METROPOLIS WILL WITNESS THE WONDERFUL PAGEANT OF FLOATS—TO BE CARNIVAL NIGHT.

(American News Service) New York, Oct. 2—Five hundred thousand children played their part in the Hudson-Fulton celebration today and in fifty-six separate centers in the greater city there were individual demonstrations while the youngsters, many of them in costume, paid tribute to Henry Hudson and Robert Fulton.

So far as the daylight hours were concerned this was children's day in New York. With the Half-Moon and Clermont and many of the dignitaries up the state celebrating with the people of the Hudson valley, it fell to juvenile New York today to continue the splendid display. The biggest daylight event on the program was a monster pageant for which preparations were made for more than 100 participants, as the minimum number. The procession was a single, long-drawn out line, there were fifty-six separate parades each taking a different route and converging at one point.

A Great Spectacle. Tonight under the glow of a myriad of incandescents and with fifty floats depicting allegorical and other subjects in line, poetry, music and art will come into their own. It is to be carnival night with Fifth avenue and Central Park west as the centers. The children's program for today was organized with a view to presenting one of the most impressive scenes of the entire celebration. They were drilled for weeks in their schools and many of them were attired in costume, some of Dutch, Indian and Colonial styles and others of more modern periods.

The costumed parts in the parade were taken by children of the parochial, private and corporate schools while the escort and the singing was furnished by thousands of public school children.
