IS NOT BADLY HURT

Frank Metzger, the young man who

was injured at the Murray theater yesterday afternoon when the cornice of the front of the building pulled loose and toppled over him amid a shower of bricks and mortar, is not as seriously injured as was at first supposed. It was thought at the time that the young man had been fatally hurt, but an investigation later disclosed the fact that the report was erroneous. An ugly scalp wound about five inches long, but not deep, is practically the extent of the boy's injuries. The wound is not considered serious and Metzger will probably be sent home from the hospital tomorrow or perhaps this evening.

INCREASE IN STOCK
