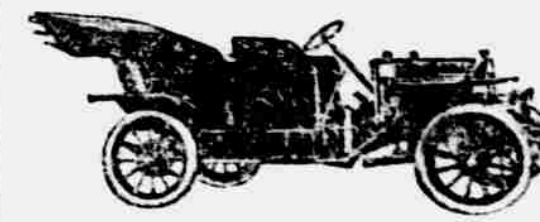

in admitting evidence of similar transactions to prove intent."

"We cannot agree with the counsel for the plaintiff in error in calling the transaction complained of in the indictment, legitimate and proper banking transactions."

"The objection to the verdict on the ground of inconsistency and repugnancy, we do not think is well taken."

The last paragraph of the decree sums up the objections to the decision on the ground of interference with the jury, and affirms the sentence of the lower court.

## IS NOT BADLY HURT

## INCREASE IN STOCK
