PLANS A QUIZ FOR WIFE

ITS DIFFERENT NOW

Small Boy Does Not Like to Play Hookey as Much As Formerly.

GEORGE BISHOP IS CAUSE

Playing "hookey" from school is not as popular among the small boys of the city as it used to be. Perhaps the discontinuance of this practice is due in a large measure to the strenuous efforts of George Bishop, truant officer, who keeps a vigilant watch on the youngsters, and any who are caught remaining away from school without the consent of their parents or guardians, are snatched up by the officer and are very apt to get into serious trouble.

Mr. Bishop keeps in close communication with the teachers and parents of children who make a habit of staying out of school on the slightest pretext.

In many cases the original excuses invented by the youngsters on the impulse of the moment, when the big arm of the law swoops down on them and they are confronted with the exasperating and nerve jolting question, "Young man, why are you not in school?" often prove very amusing. The youngsters are immediately seized with a most alarming illness, but Officer Bishop is wise to all such "gags." One difficulty encountered by the truant officer is the refusal of many parents to reveal the names of their children who are believed to be playing "hookey." Under this handicap the matter is investigated to a great disadvantage.

The province of Prince Edward Island, Canada, has ceased to produce tobacco, all attempts having proved unprofitable. The rest of Canada produced 11,266,732 pounds in 1908, nearly all in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario. The dominion turned out \$15,274,923 worth of tobacco (manufactured), cigars, cigarettes and snuff in 1908, besides importing \$3,385,348 worth, of which \$3,247,429 worth was from the United States. Consumption of tobacco increased from 1,755 pounds a head in 1869 to 2,257 pounds in 1908.

TEMPERANCE DAY TO BE OBSERVED

Churches in This City Will Devote Sunday, Nov. 28, To That Cause.

PLANS BEING PREPARED

IT IS EXPECTED SEVERAL PROMINENT ANTI-SALOON WORKERS WILL BE IN THE CITY TO ASSIST IN SERVICES.

Arrangements for the fitting celebration of World's Temperance Sunday, November 28, will probably be made at the meeting of the Ministerial Association Monday. The officials of the State Anti-Saloon league have promised local ministers that speakers would be furnished for all churches, the pulpits of which will be offered for observance of the day.

Sunday afternoon services will be held at one of the churches in all probability. At this meeting many prominent workers in the Anti-Saloon League will be present, including the Rev. Shumaker, state superintendent, the Rev. Mr. Barney, Mr. Minter, attorney for the league, and others.

It is expected that on this day the first organized efforts to declare this county dry by county local option in 1911, will be taken. This, however, the ministers will not state positively, although it is admitted that there will be another election, if a favorable result appears possible.
