## HOUSE IS ALMOST BURNED TO GROUND

Building on South Twelfth Street Catches Fire From An Overheated Flue.

## WAS SPECTACULAR BLAZE

TWO FIREMEN HAD FINGERS BADLY FROSTED WHILE FIGHTING THE BLAZE—TENANTS WERE JUST MOVING IN.

Fire originating from an overheated flue in the residence of Peter M. Treiber, 129 South Twelfth street, caused about \$500 damages last night. The fire started at about 11 o'clock. A young man who chanced to be passing by the house at the time discovered flames ensuing from the roof and immediately turned in an alarm from box No. 31. Only the quick arrival of the fire departments prevented the total destruction of the building.

Mr. and Mrs. Treiber had stored their goods in the house and were just preparing to move into the building. Owing to the intense cold and the high wind that prevailed the fire was exceptionally hard to fight. A crystal of ice was immediately formed whenever water was thrown and the work of climbing over the building in an effort to fight the flames was extremely difficult. The firemen had several narrow escapes from serious falls.

## Fire Fighting Difficult.

So intense was the cold that Walter Muey and John Clements, firemen at No. 3 hose house, had their fingers badly frosted while there were several other cases of frosty noses and ears among the fire fighters. Despite the cold a large crowd of onlookers witnessed the fire and experienced the same difficulty in keeping warm as did the firemen.

Although the blaze was gotten under control shortly after the arrival of the departments, it was fully two hours before the fire was extinguished. Practically all of the household goods were removed from the burning building and the damage in this regard was slight, it is said. The roof of the house was totally destroyed. The fire was very spectacular, the flames leaping high in the air, and fanned by the wind, raged furiously for a time.
