Sensational Escape From Devil's Island

Fugitive Serving a Life Sentence Makes Successful Getaway
After Being Central Figure in a Shooting Affray.

(Special Cable from the International News Service.)

London, April 22.—The recent ar-

rest at Liverpool of a Frenchman named Marian, has brought to light another sensational escape from Devil's Island, the penal settlement in French Guiana of Dreyfus fame.

The fugitive was undergoing a life sentence for attempted murder and after getting from the dread isle made his way to Europe and spent some time on the Continent. He then embarked at Liverpool for New York, but the authorities would not allow him to land, on the ground that he was an undesirable. Meanwhile his identity was discovered, and when he arrived back at Liverpool on the Mauretania two detectives boarded the vessel and arrested him. The police describe him as being connected with
