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

What little information we now have about the new Russian dreadnaughts tells more than many words could do. The four now in course of construction, the *Sevastopol*, the *Petropavlosk*, the *Gangut* and the *Poltava*, are each 500 feet long, 88 feet wide and 27 feet three inches deep, and have a displacement of 23,000 tons. They are to be of 42,000 horsepower and will have a speed of 23 knots. The first two are being built by the Baltic shipyards the last two at the Imperial yard.—Lokal Anzeiger.
