flood after its principal fury had been spent. Within 48 hours a 650 foot bridge had been thrown across the largest gap and the work of opening the way for the arrival of supplies and relief corps was under way.

"Don't ask others to do what you yourself would not do," is the way in which Mr. Miller explains the quick and speedy way in which the washed-out railroad was replaced and relief given to hundreds of helpless persons.

Still robust, fluent in speech and caring for his personal business Mr. Miller says he feels in as good health as at any time in the last thirty years.

Old English Laws About buttons. Buttons have engaged the attention of legislators even more frequently than hats. Five acts have been passed to protect the button industry of England, and some of these are still unrepealed.

An act of George I. inflicts a penalty of 40 shillings on any person using or selling "buttons made of cloth, serge, druggat, frieze or camel."

This law, says the London Daily Mail, was a source of intense annoyance to foreign visitors, and the author of "Le Parisien a Londres," a guide written in 1789, is careful to explain its provisions at considerable length.

He adds, however, that foreigners "who are able to prove that their clothes were made in their own country escape the penalty when first summoned on the understanding that they change their buttons within twenty-four hours."
