IMPROVEMENTS IN CITY PREDICTED

Mayor Zimmerman Says Next Year Administration Will Make a Record.

HANDICAPPED THIS YEAR

BOARD OF WORKS MET THIS MORNING AND TRANSACTED SOME ROUTINE BUSINESS—CAR COMPANY WARNED.

"We're broke now and people may call it a 'do nothing' administration if they will," said Mayor Zimmerman in the meeting of the board of works this morning, "but we'll make the town hum with work next year and make one of the most progressive administrations Richmond ever had." The occasion for this statement was as usual, the always present question of economy in city affairs. A petition for the improvement of South Tenth from Main to South A streets on the west side was referred back to council with the instruction that unless the property owners would pay the city's share of the expense the improvement could not be made.

Instruction has been given to the street car company to immediately clean up South Eighth street where brick is being placed between the tracks. A great deal of complaint has been made on account of the condition of the street and several wagons have been broken and horses injured there.

Festival Signs.

The executive committee of the Fall Festival was given permission to hang two large signs advertising the festival one at the corner of Eighth and Main street and the other at the corner of North Eighth and E streets. It was, however, decided that no signs could be hung which were in the interest of a private business proposition.
