REPORT BY GOVERNMENT

One report from the United States embassy at London, which cites several successful prosecutions for fraud practiced on claimants, says: "The condition of the law in this country (England) does not favor the division of estates, and the statutes of limitation and repose rigidly prevent the collection of stale and antiquated claims.
