

VERY CONFUSING ARE THE REPORTS

Balloons Are Seen in Various Places in Canada, but None Found Yet.

IS GASBAG A DERELICT?

IT IS THOUGHT IMPOSSIBLE IT COULD CARRY PASSENGERS AFTER BEING IN THE AIR OVER 72 HOURS.

Toronto, Oct. 26.—A confusing report reached Lewis Spindler, representative of the St. Louis Aero club here today regarding the lost balloon America II and occupants, Hawley and Post. From Ft. Williams, near the west end of Lake Superior came a dispatch stating that Mail Clerk Gueard and two companion mail clerks of the Canadian Pacific, saw a balloon with lights plainly visible for nearly an hour. It passed over Oulmette station, forty miles east of Ft. Williams Monday night. Mr. Spindler thinks this balloon must have been a derelict, as no balloon could carry passengers seventy-two hours. The fate of the occupants is conjectural.

Rev. Seames, of Chapleau, wired Spindler that a balloon which passed there Thursday was traveling southward, headed over Lake Superior.

SEVERAL SEE BALLOON.

Kenora, Ont. Oct. 26.—Several persons here saw a balloon rapidly traveling in a northerly direction early this morning.

SEE ONE DESCENDING.

Port Arthur, Ont., Oct. 26.—Forest rangers in the government employ reported a balloon descending in a forest between here and Black Sturgeon lake this morning.

SCHENEMAN IS BETTER

William B. Scheneman, who broke his leg on Sunday morning, October 8th, while returning from the Hippodrome grounds where he was a spectator, is rapidly recovering at Reid Memorial hospital. He and his daughter were riding in a wagon and he dismounted at Fifteenth and Main streets. He started to hand his daughter a music roll and the horses became frightened, throwing him to the street. His leg was caught in the hub of the wheel and he was dragged for a considerable distance before the team was stopped.

PROMPTNESS REQUIRED.

The law requiring ministers and justices of the peace to file marriage returns within three days after the ceremony has been performed has taken several by surprise lately as they have been unacquainted with this important feature. He is fighting for the common people, the laborers in the ditches and the employees of the factories. If protection in certain branches of industry does not benefit the laborers for that industry but only those who control it, then, Mr. Clawson said, Senator Beveridge is against such protection.

A Step at Shively.

In 1907 Senator LaFollette, of Wisconsin, the arch insurgent of them all, introduced a tariff commission bill in the senate which thoroughly covered the subject. It would have compelled trusts or corporations to produce their books, records and the like before the commission and from these facts the commission would determine on the protection needed by the corporations. Senator Shively, the democratic member from Indiana, now sneering at Beveridge's stand for a tariff commission, voted for Senator LaFollette's bill, said Mr. Clawson.

Senator Beveridge, the speaker said, is the personification of righteousness in the nation. He has the courage, and the nerve to stand up and fight for what he believes is just and due to the people generally.

SLAYER IS A FIEND

Deeds of "Jack the Ripper" in London Are Reproduced in Cincinnati.

FIFTH WOMAN FOUND DEAD

Cincinnati, Oct. 26.—That a fiend, actuated by the same motives as London's "Jack the Ripper," is responsible for the death of five women of this city is the theory of the police today. The latest victim is Mrs. Harley C. Hackney, whose body was found last night within a stone's throw of the place where Mrs. Ann Lloyd was murdered last New Year's eve.

Mrs. Hackney was found murdered in her home on Canal bridge, Cummington. Her throat was cut from ear to ear, her skull crushed and her body badly bruised. Nearby there lay an axe with which the murderer had done his work.

The discovery was made by her husband and a boarder, Charles E. Eckert, who were returning from their day's work. The husband and Eckert were taken in charge by the police and are being held, pending an investigation. In many ways the crime resembles that committed on Miss Anna Lloyd, Miss Luella Mueller, Miss Alma Steinweg and Miss Mary McDonald, all of whom were killed within a few blocks of last night's crime. The murderer is supposed to have fled and the police are searching for evidence which will aid them in their search.

A FAMINE EXPECTED

And Storm Stricken Italians Are Also Facing a Pestilence Today.

MOB A CABINET OFFICER

Naples, Oct. 26.—Famine and pestilence threatens the unharmed residents of Ischia Island and the zone devastated by the cloudburst, tidal wave and volcanic eruption. The government received reports today from new sections of the storm zone, adding new details to the horror.

In some of the towns fluid mud buries streets to a height of 18 feet. In others streets have been completely washed out, all the buildings falling.

Further means of communication were established today. The towns chiefly damaged are Casamicola,

Amneo, Positano, Lacco, Torro del Graco, Recina, Portico and Cetara.

Today between 90 and 100 corpses had been recovered. Official advises to Rome led the home office to set the number of dead at 200, although this estimate is believed to be far too conservative.

Mrs. Gibson, mother of Charles Dana Gibson, is at Ischia. She is believed to be safe.

The minister of marine was mobbed at Ischia by the hunger-crazed people who had everything swept away. Tents and foodstuffs have been sent by ship.

Orange, N. J., Oct. 26.—An interesting wedding took place in the Hillside church here today, when Miss Rowland Mix, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Rowland Mix, of New York City, was married to Mr. Arthur Howard Blight of Toronto. The bride is a well known gold expert and at one time she was the holder of the metropolitan championship title. The wedding ceremony was followed by a large reception at the Essex County Country Club.
