

THREE DENTISTS ON EXAMINERS' BOARD

State Association Selects Members At Convention—Officers Chosen.

(National News Association)
INDIANAPOLIS, May 22.—Three members of the Indiana state board of dental examination were chosen from the Indiana State Dental Association yesterday afternoon. Thirteen were nominated. Those selected were F. R. Hinchey, Indianapolis; A. R. Reitz, Evansville, and H. C. Sexton, Shelbyville. These dentists, with one to be appointed by Governor Ralston and another to be chosen by the state board of health, will constitute the board of dental examination.

Officers were elected for the ensuing year as follows: W. E. Kennedy of Indianapolis, president; R. R. Gillis of Hammond, vice president over J. E. Stokely of South Bend; trustees, Charles Erwin of Terre Haute, E. C. Vandervoegen of Crawfordsville and W. L. Myer of Rensselaer. The association voted to affiliate with the National Dental Association. Five delegates and five alternates to the national meeting will be appointed by the new president.

The secretary's report showed a membership of 950, an increase of 100 in a year. Fewer than 100 Indiana dentists are not in the rolls.

A class of forty-two pupils from public school No. 9, under the supervision of Mrs. Francis M. Kelsey, principal, and Mrs. Blanch G. Williams, teacher of the 8A grade, was used by the association for a demonstration. Later the children were given an illustrated lecture by Dr. George Edwin Hunt of the Indiana Dental College on the proper care of teeth.

The examiners were Drs. D. A. House, Indianapolis; H. A. Heesler, Crawfordsville; F. R. Hinchey, Indianapolis; George West, Chicago; Ray Kibler, Indianapolis, and W. L. Myer, Rensselaer. Each pupil was presented a written record of his case. A majority of the children showed need of dental attention and almost without exception the anemic and underdeveloped ones were found to have either adenoids or irregular and defective teeth. Following the examination the motion picture film, "Toothache," was shown.

Dr. W. H. G. Logan, an instructor in the dental department of Valparaiso University, lectured at the session.




