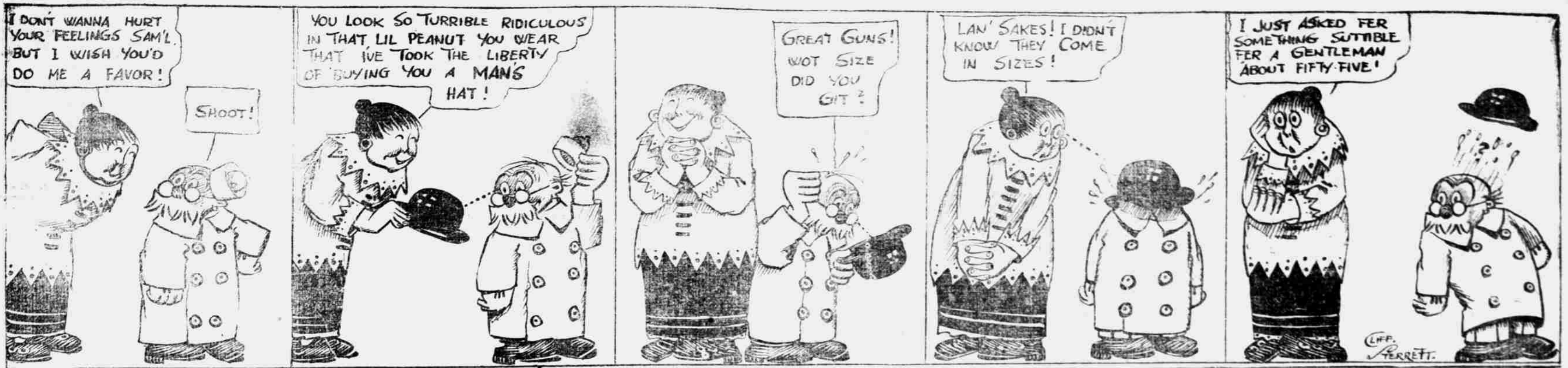

Four Cases of Diphtheria Reported in Baldorf Family.

NEW PARIS, Ohio, Oct. 7.—The Jefferson Township trustees have issued a notice to land owners regarding the law passed by the last legislature which requires them to keep the weeds and brush cut along the road side. Upon their failure to do so, the trustees shall order the road superintendent to have them cut, the cost to be charged against the land owners, placed upon the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes.
