

DR. NG POON CHEW TO SPEAK SUNDAY

Noted Chinamen to Tell of
Conditions Against Which
Countrymen Contend.

Dr. Ng Poon Chew, "the Mark Twain of China," will speak in the college chapel Sunday morning, at the First Presbyterian church at 4:45, and at the First M. E. church at 7:30 o'clock.

Dr. Ng is perhaps the best educated man of his race in this country. He was heard by thousands at the world's Christian citizens conference and was greeted with much applause. He delighted several audiences at Winona lake last season.

He gives much information as to conditions in China, and concerning the troubles his people have been experiencing in their efforts to establish a new government. Dr. Ng is a member of the American Academy of Political and Social Science, of the Chinese League of Justice, etc. He has been advised by the Chinese consulate general at San Francisco.

He studied in Occidental school and San Francisco Theological seminary. He entered the ministry, but resigning from this he established a Chinese weekly illustrated paper, and later established the first Chinese daily in this country. He will be heard with considerable interest in Richmond Sunday.

Persons who can not hear Dr. Ng at their own churches may hear him at the First Presbyterian church at 4:45 o'clock.

Dr. Ng has been favorably noticed by the press of the country. One paper calls him "the Mark Twain of China," another "the most brilliant Chinaman in America."

From Toledo comes the word: "Mr. Ng Poon Chew has come and gone. In his address yesterday noon to one hundred men at our Commercial club and again last evening at our own church to a large and intelligent audience, he made such a favorable impression that all who heard him will not soon forget Ng Poon Chew."

CHICAGO CLAIMS

\$41,640,000 Expended Last
Year for Instruments and
Instructions.

CHICAGO, April 2.—Expenditures of \$41,640,000 last year for musical instruments and instruction is basis for the claim that Chicago is the "loud noise" in the musical world. It is a fact that the factories for the manufacture of instruments are the largest in the world, and that the experience with piano buyers on the installment plan who "skip" is altogether colossal. With the factory output of pianos in the hundreds daily, the sales machinery has had to be built on an international scale.

It is also said that more than \$1,000,000 a year is paid out for the grand opera produced in the midst of this music industry. TO PROTECT RIGHTS Twenty-five Nines to Attend Meeting Here.

The circuit will be for the mutual benefit of members and not for the purpose of a regular league. Although games will be held between the different nines of the circuit, the organization is more for the purpose of protecting the interests of the teams in the organization than for the formation of a league.

The circuit is the outgrowth of the attempt made by Cincinnati managers to boost the price of games. The managers of Cincy teams have doubled the price for an out-of-town game over that of last year, and expected the home teams to act the goat in a quiet manner. The goat, however, fails to submit to the trust of baseball managers and will give the trust teams the ultimatum of same price or no game.
