Notice is hereby given by the board of public works of the city of Richmond, Indiana, that on the 8th day of October, 1914, they approved an assessment roll showing the prima facie assessments for the following described public improvement, as authorized by the improvement resolution named: Improvement Resolution No. 410, 1914.

Providing for the construction of cement sidewalk on the east side of North Twelfth street, from North G street to the river.

Improvement Resolution No. 420, 1914. Providing for the improvement of Richmond avenue by grading, graveling the roadway and the construction of cement curb, gutters and 6 foot sidewalks on both sides of street, from North West Fifth street to the west corporation line.
