

Y. M. C. ADVANCES IN RACE FOR PRIZE

With Total of 608 Points Local Association Gets Into Fourth Place.

With a total of 358 points, Richmond has advanced to fourth place in the inter-city Y. M. C. A. membership campaign. At 8 o'clock last night the official report of the results of the efforts of the teams representing the local association showed Richmond had made 60 points, including nine new members, fifty-nine renewals and the collection of \$545.

The standing of the competing cities, deducting handicaps, follows: Crawfordsville, 742.5 points; Vincennes, 504 points; Auburn, 491 points; Richmond, 358 points; Evansville, 291 points; Indianapolis Railroad association, 260 points; Michigan City, 134 points; New Albany, 76 points; South Bend, 59 points. Indianapolis, Lafayette and Terre Haute have not yet overcome their handicaps.

Captains of the Richmond teams held a conference and luncheon yesterday. A mass meeting of the workers will be held at 7:30 o'clock Friday evening to make plans for a whirlwind finish.
