WAR SCARE DRIVES WHEAT PRICE DOWN

(BY LEASED WIRE.)

CHICAGO, March 2.—May wheat on the board of trade after a wild day, as a result of the latest developments in the European war, closed at \$1.42 1/2, or 5 1/4c under yesterday's finish, after a range of 7 1/2c. The low point was \$1.41 1/4 and the high \$1.47 1/2. July closed at \$1.16 1/2, a loss of 1 1/4c. Corn closed higher, May gaining 1 1/4c for the day, and July 1 1/4c. May oats gained 1/4c. Provisions made good gains.
