

GERMAN WASPS SINK 3 SHIPS IN 36 HOURS

Submarine Activity in Widely Distant Points Causes Terror in Shipping Circles of England.

[BY LEASED WIRE.] LONDON, March 10.—After a brief lull, the activities on German submarines against British merchant shipping have been resumed with redoubled vigor. Three British ships have been sunk in the last thirty-six hours, and another was chased, but managed to escape owing to superior speed and seamanship. The sinking of the three vessels at widely different points shows that the British Isles are practically encircled by hostile underwater boats.

The Tangistan, whose destruction cost the lives of thirty-seven men, was sunk at Scarborough in the North Sea. The Blockwood was attacked and sunk in the English channel, off Hastings, and the Princess Victoria was torpedoed and destroyed off Liverpool in the Irish Sea.

The Clan Line steamer Clanmacrae was chased through the Irish Sea off the mouth of the Mersey river, but avoided destruction by tacking on a neutral flag and putting on full steam.

So many submarines have been reported in the last two days at various points in British waters that naval experts have come to the conclusion that the Germans have managed to make good their recent losses among the undersea boats. This seems to confirm reports that eleven submarines were recently sent to the new German naval base at Zeebrugge, Belgium.

British rejoicing over the success of the international war fleet was turned to dismay by the official announcement of the admiralty that three English merchant ships had been lost.

HILLING KILLS WIFE

threw the chief's powerful fire searchlight into the loft window of the barn, but it failed to reveal the murderer. McHenry decided that the third shot heard in the barn had been directed by Hilling at himself. McNally and several other officers with drawn guns then entered the barn and rushed up the stairs. Behind the iron barricade was the body of Hilling.

Jealousy Causes Murder.

Hilling's motive for killing his wife, who was about 40 years old and a woman of good character, the police say, was his intense jealousy of her. This all the members of the family assert. It is said that Hilling did not like his sister-in-law, Mrs. Temple and when his wife went down town with her Monday evening it made him furious and upon her return he created a scene at their home. Yesterday morning he was still in a vicious mood and finally Mrs. Hilling went to the home of his sister and her daughter, Mrs. Eales, where she remained until the murder.

About 10 o'clock yesterday morning, police records show, Mrs. Temple telephoned a complaint to headquarters, saying that Hilling had been at her home and had insulted her. Hilling then came down town and visited several saloons. In the afternoon he visited a second-hand store and purchased a revolver, 38-calibre, after he had been assured that it would work perfectly and accurately. He said he wanted it to kill a dog.

"I am positive the man was not drunk when he bought the gun," said the proprietor of the shop. "No drunk man could beat me down to fifty cents for the gun I sold him."

Before returning home Hilling took a ride on a belt line car. He was a former employee of the company and was known to the conductor, who remarked to him jocularly, "Have you anything on the hip?"

"No, but I have something awfully heavy on my mind," Hilling somberly answered.

About 5 o'clock in the afternoon Hilling again called at the Temple home. He had some words with his sister-in-law, it is said, then entered another room, where he found Mrs. Hilling reclining on a couch, suffering from sick headache. He sat at the foot of the couch for some time upbraiding his wife and demanding that she return home with him. About 6 o'clock he suddenly arose, pulled his revolver and shot Mrs. Hilling, the bullet entering the left temple and coming out over the right ear. Her death was instantaneous.

Waving his smoking revolver aloft Hilling rushed out of the house and disappeared down an alley. In an instant the neighborhood was in a furor and a call after call was sent into police headquarters. In a remarkably short time Desk Sergeant Winters had practically the entire police department on the trail of the murderer. It was not until about 7 o'clock that he

Rev. E. E. Davis Answers Question Assigned for Noon Shop Worship.

TURKS CLAIM

Official dispatches telling of the second bombardment of Fort Rumilleh Medjidieh Tabla, situated on Point Kild Bahr, in the Dardanelles, were supplemented by advices from Athens to the effect that the Turks attempted to effect a coup by which they hoped to sink some of the ships in the fleet.

Fort Rumilleh Medjidieh Tabla had apparently been reduced and the admiralty announced officially on Monday night that its batteries had been silenced, but when the ships of the line attempted to move forward to concentrate their fire against Cam Kalesi and the batteries near Kephez Bernu they were suddenly greeted by a hot fire from the heavy Turkish guns.

The appearance of the Great Britain super-dreadnought, Queen Elizabeth, in the Dardanelles, with her 15-inch guns, shows that the damage inflicted upon her by Turkish guns while she was lying in the Gulf of Saros was slight.

Although the fire of this mighty warship at a 12 miles range across the Peninsula of Gallipoli had been effective, Vice Admiral Sackville Hamilton Carden reckoned that the giant guns of this vessel would be of better service at close range, so he ordered the ship to join a squadron which was entering the Dardanelles to renew the attack upon Fort Rumilleh Medjidieh Tabla.

A veil of silence and mystery has been thrown over the plans for land operations, but it is reported on good authority that twenty-two transports bearing between 30,000 and 35,000 troops are on their way to the Dardanelles sphere of action.
