WHEAT PRICE LOWER ON CHICAGO MARKET

CHICAGO, July 20.—Wheat was sensationally lower today, losing $\frac{1}{4}$ c., September declining $\frac{3}{4}$ c. and December off $\frac{3}{4}$ c. It was a weather market from the opening to the closing, and there seemed to be no reactionary power left in the wheat market of the world. It was said that the sales in all positions yesterday amounted to 1,000,000 bushels of wheat. The board reported little doing today, and there were no sales at Chicago. Corn closed $\frac{1}{4}$ c. higher to $\frac{1}{4}$ c. lower, and oats were $\frac{1}{4}$ c. lower. Cash sales of corn were 160,000 bushels and of oats 680,000 bushels. Hog products were off sharply in price, with July pork losing most.

FIRE CAUSES LOSS


