Ezra Frazier and Joe Cain are painting the M. E. church near Carlos City.

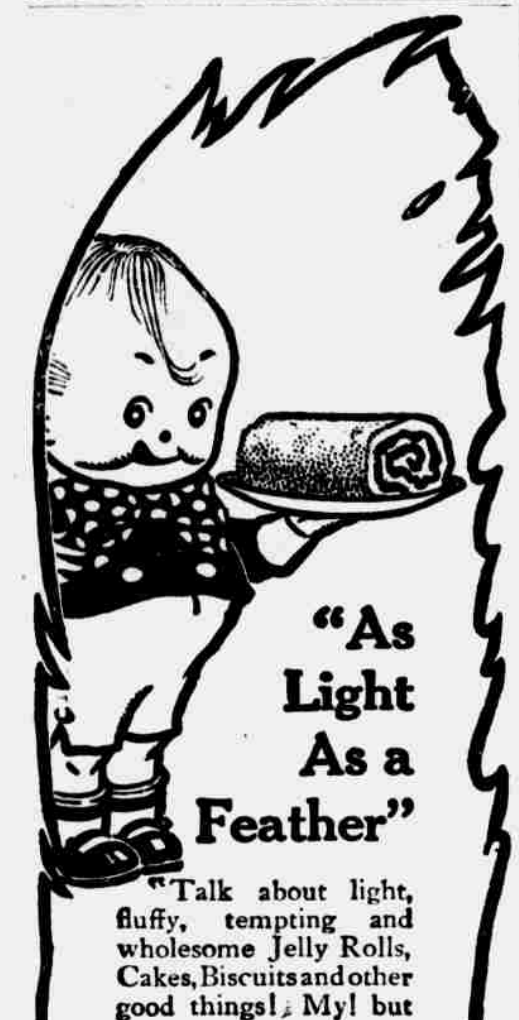

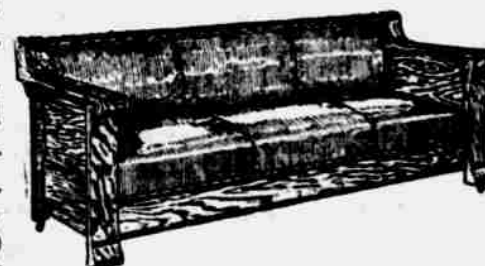

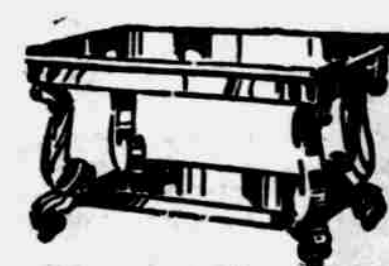
