

FUGITIVES SUFFER IN SIBERIAN INTERIOR


BUCHAREST, Oct. 7.—Hundreds of Germans who have been driven from the interior and the southern provinces of Russia are arriving daily

at Urgeni on the Rumanian border. The fugitives are mostly old men and women and children, as all Germans, Austrians and Hungarians of military age have been sent to concentration camps between Moscow and the Urals mountains in Siberia.

Almost without exception the fugitives are in a pitiable condition and penniless, although many of them formerly were very wealthy. Escorted by Cossacks they have travelled hun-

dreds of miles afoot and in freight cars and their sufferings in most cases have been terrible. Before they are pushed across the Rumanian border all money over 500 roubles is taken from them.

Charles Carroll of Carrollton, Md. "Father of Religious Liberty in America"
