

CHICAGO, March 6.—The wheat market was easy at the start today and prices were $\frac{1}{4}$ cent lower. Statistics were bearish. The market was nervous and prices fluctuated rapidly on small orders. Unfavorable weather had a strengthening effect on the corn market, and prices were up $\frac{1}{4}$ cent. Commission houses were fair buyers. Offerings were light. Oats were $\frac{1}{4}$ cent higher and the market was firm with corn. Provisions were firmer and higher.
