

G. O. P. HURLS BIG SPEAKERS INTO COUNTRY

The Wayne County Republican committee probably will secure some of the most noted Republican members of Congress to speak here during this fall's campaign. Wayne county is favorably looked up by the Indiana speakers' bureau, County Chairman L. S. Bowman said today.

The Indiana Republican committee has been fortunate in securing more big speakers than any other states will have during this year's campaign.

Among the United States senators who have promised they will speak in Indiana are Harding, of Ohio; Borah, of Idaho; Norris, of Nebraska; Cummins, of Iowa; Curtis, of Kansas; Sherman of Illinois and Wadsworth of New York. The list of members of the house is headed by "Uncle Joe" Cannon, and includes Representatives Fess of Ohio; Foss of Illinois; Campbell of Kansas; Dowell of Iowa; Rodenburgh, of Illinois; Meeker, of Missouri; Sweet, of Iowa, and many others.

"Wayne county can get whoever pleases from this list," county chairman Bowman said today.


