INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., July 29.—The Advertisers' club gave a special dinner last night, and with a true ad-price to just \$1.49.

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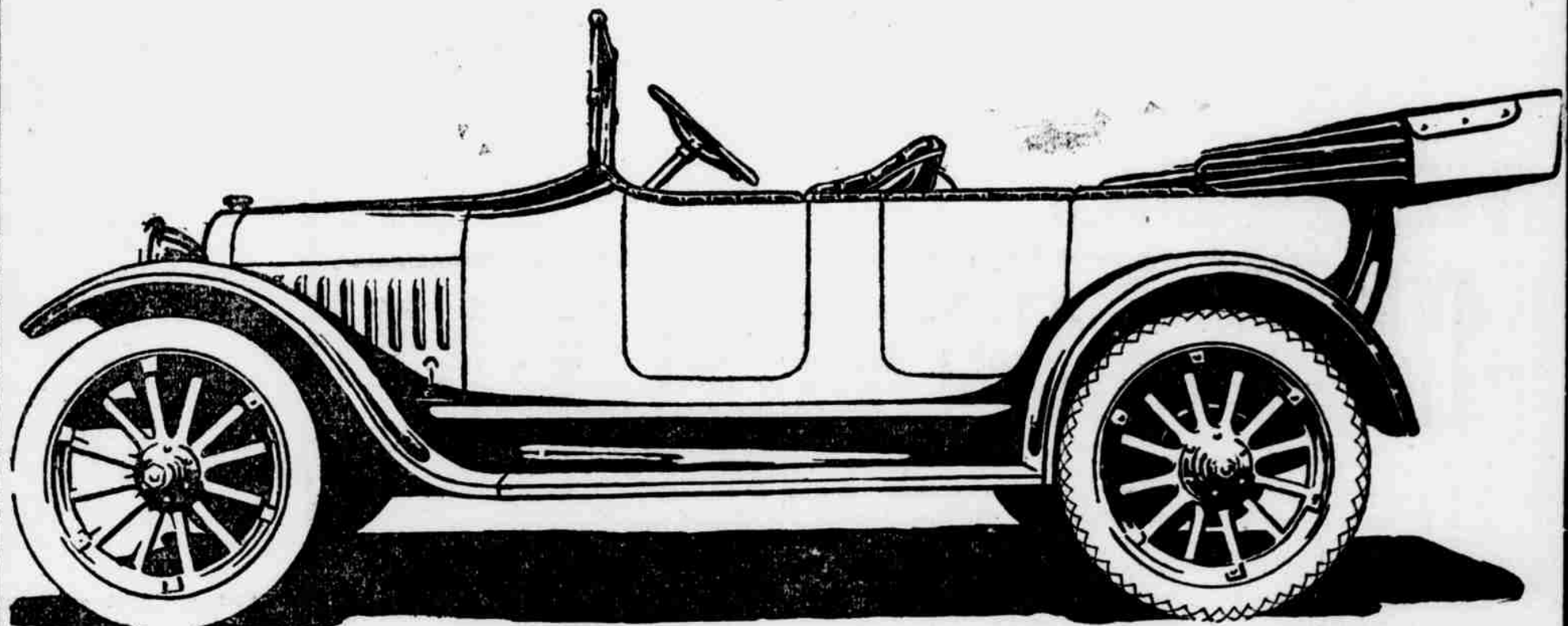


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
