

## WOMAN WHO READ BIBLE THREE TIMES IS DEAD AT EATON

EATON, O., Sept. 28.—Mrs. Christina Wesco, the county's oldest and most remarkable woman, died about 2:30 Wednesday afternoon at her home on East Main street. Infirmitides were responsible.

The deceased was born Dec. 12, 1822 in Maryland, but most of her life had been spent in Preble and Montgomery counties. For more than 45 years she lived in the home in which she died.

She boasted the fact that she had read the Bible through three times, and declared she was glad she had done so when her eyes were such as to permit.

Mrs. Wesco was the widow of Reuben Wesco, who died about twenty years ago. She is survived by these children: Mrs. Ellen Sample, of this city; Mrs. Clarissa White and Mrs. Maria Waters of Dayton; Marion Wesco, living east of Eaton, and Jonathan Wesco, who resided at home.
