DEMOCRATS Look! Listen! Register!

You can't vote on November 7th unless, on next Monday, October 9th, you shall have complied with the registration law. You must register then, unless (1) you both registered for, and voted at the November, 1914, election, and (2) you have also since continuously lived in the same precinct. The first voter, the voter who either failed to register or vote in 1914, and also the voter, who may have voted in 1914, but has since moved out of the precinct, must register next Monday, October 9th, or lose his vote in November.

A registration board will be in session in your precinct from 6:00 A. M. to 9:00 P. M., October 9th. If you are sick, or will be unavoidably absent from the county on registration day, you can register by affidavit sworn to before a Notary Public or County Clerk, and witnessed by two freeholders of the precinct, and filed on Oct. 9 with the registration board. The Democratic County Chairman has blank applications and affidavits at Democratic headquarters, over Starr Piano Store, Richmond. If necessary to use affidavit, get it now and fill it out. Know that your name is on your precinct registration book on October 9th. If in doubt, go before the precinct registration board that day and inquire if your name is on the record. Don't delay or neglect, or you may lose your vote.
