

# Essad Pacha Under Sentence



ESSAD - PACHA

A report is current in London that a Turkish court martial in Constantinople has passed the death sentence on Essad Pacha, formerly provisional president of Albania.

He was charged with having conspired with hands against the Turkish Empire and with having declared war on Turkey.

Essad Pacha was deprived of his rank in the Turkish army after he joined the Italians in Albania in January, 1916. He later went to Rome, and in March left Italy for Paris, where he was received by the Premier, Mr. Briand. He was sentenced to death at Constantinople in June, and in August was reported to be commanding an Albanian contingent which landed at Salonica.

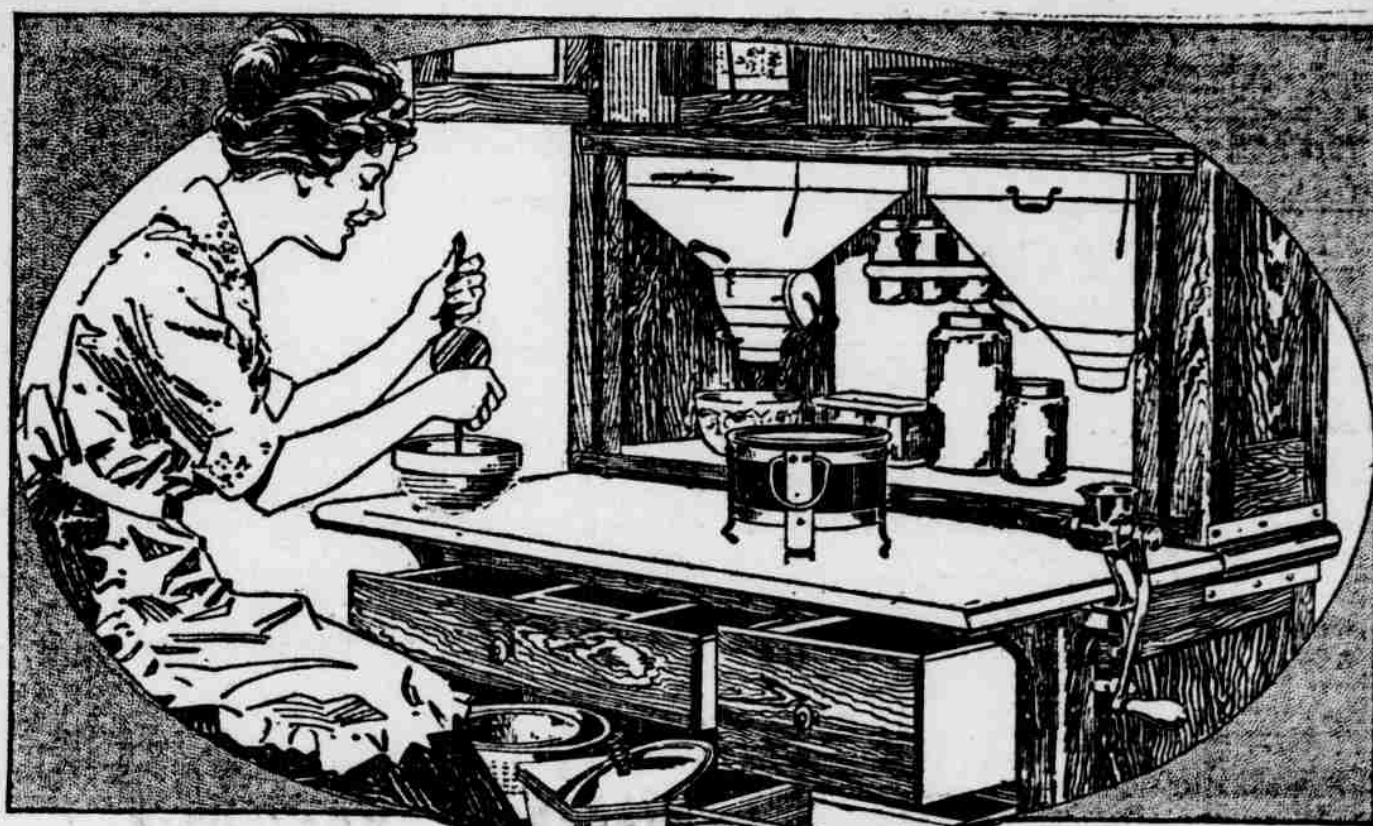
