"I know of a certain shoe which we purchased last spring and sold at \$4 to our customers," said Mr. Ramsey. "The other day we ordered the same shoe for a young lady. The shoe cost us \$4.25, about 40 per cent. more than it cost us before."

"We face a prospect of \$8, \$10 and \$12 shoes unless something is done by the government to get the leather out of Russia. Our shoes are going

out and no leather is coming in while great quantities are rotting in Russia for lack of someone to move the leather. An export duty on shoes might save us."

MEN'S TROUSERS DON'T BAG AT KNEES NOW SAYS DRY CLEANER
