a large number of the men, like the British and French, are wearing the new steel helmets, a recent innovation in the Russian army. The photograph also furnishes an excellent description of the hilly nature of the country throughout the war theater on the Macedonian front.

WOMEN'S RIGHT TO CAST BALLOT SERMON SUBJECT

"Women should be given the right to vote," declared Rev. W. O. Stovall, in addressing the Junior Order of United American Mechanics and Daughters of America at the First Baptist church last night.

"Every argument which is cast against woman suffrage would have twice the weight if it were cast at man's right to vote.

"Where women have the right to vote, conditions have in no instance grown worse and in several cases they have grown better.

"If women, after they have had the franchise only a few years, can exercise the ballot as well as men, what could they do with one hundred and forty years of experience."

The Rev. Mr. Stovall defined "The Complete Citizen" as a man who is always anxious to do what he can for his country.

"The man who is unfaithful to his home, who does not recognize the laws of home, is a traitor to his country. The stability of this nation is founded on good, pure homes."

DR. HURTY EXPLAINS HOW TO STOP COLDS

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 6.—An epidemic of "colds" over the greater part of the state has caused the State Board of Health, through Dr. J. N. Hurty, its secretary to issue a short circular on "How Colds Are Caught."

"All colds, and indeed all diseases of the breathing organs are due largely to air starvation. Overeating lessens resistance for a brief period while the abused stomach is trying to digest the overload of garbage; and this abuse of the body being followed by a second abuse of not giving it enough air runs resistance down so low that the cold microbes, which are everywhere, get in their work."
