

HIGH SCHOOL CLUB ORGANIZED AT "Y" TO HEAR BIG MEN

As the result of the banquet of intermediate boys held at the Y. M. C. A. last night in honor of the new boys' secretary, Ross Williams, a permanent high school club will be organized. All members of the "Y" who attend high school are eligible.

CITY PLANT

1916, was \$186,657.32 of which \$45,000.00 was obtained from the ac-

quisition of the private plant. For these twelve months our average income per K. W. H. sold was .0310. 1,410,658 K. W. H. was the amount of business we received from the private plant for the nine months' operation, which we received \$45,000.00.

Report Shows the Cost.

Our cost per K. W. H. generated and delivered was .01236 which would make the total operating expense of the business we obtained from the private plant \$17,435.73. In order not to get confused with our annual report which shows our cost per K. W. H. generated and delivered .011135; this, however, represents the amount of money expended during the year. The actual operating expense for the year 1916 should be \$17,435.73. The difference between those two items is coal. We actually paid out \$23,479.95 for coal during the year 1916, but the actual amount used at boilers was \$30,694.27 which will make a difference in the actual amount of coal purchased and the actual amount used of \$7,214.32.

The reason that we did not show this in our annual report was because we had to show the actual amount of money expended, irrespective of the amount of coal consumed. But in order to get the true, actual conditions, we are taking the operating expenses in this instance just as they actually are, irrespective of the amount of money expended.

Plant Shows Big Profit.
After deducting the operating expense from the additional load that we obtained from the private plant, you will note that we have a profit of \$27,564.27 for the nine months operation, or 17 per cent, plus on the amount paid for their property.

The records will show during the condemnation proceedings that the city stated that they would make, at least, \$27,000.00 a year on the business that the city would obtain by acquiring the private plant, and you will note that the city has made good its promise to the people. And just as soon as we get the new equipment that is now being installed at our plant in operation, we will be able to make a greater profit from the business that we have obtained from the acquisition.

of the private plant, and also, a still greater profit from the combined business of our utility.

Production Cost Lowered.

As you will note, the cost of production is a little over .006 per K. W. H. and we are hoping after we get the new equipment in operation to bring the cost of production down to .004 per K. W. H. at the switchboard.

We have sold \$23,549.77 worth of equipment from the private plant. However, we have not received full payment yet, but a substantial amount has been paid on the old equipment sold. We have every reason to believe that the city, including the building, will realize from the sale of the old equipment that it does not use \$40,000.00, which would leave an investment of \$172,891.00. Out of the above named amount, the plant has used in connection with the city plant \$75,000.00 worth of equipment which mostly constituted wire, meters, poles and some generating apparatus, etc.

Realize on Equipment Sale.
After adding \$75,000.00 for used material to the city plant and \$40,000.00, the amount that we will realize from the sale of the old equipment, is \$115,000.00; and subtracting \$115,000.00 from \$212,891.00, the total amount paid for the private plant, would make \$97,891.00 which the city paid for \$60,000.00 worth of business annually. And as stated above, we have made over \$27,000.00 in nine months operation of the business from the private plant, or 27 percent plus on the actual investment of \$97,891.00.

You will also note in the report that the operating expenses this year have been made heavier than any other year before by paying to the city part sal-

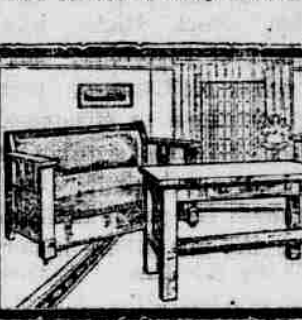

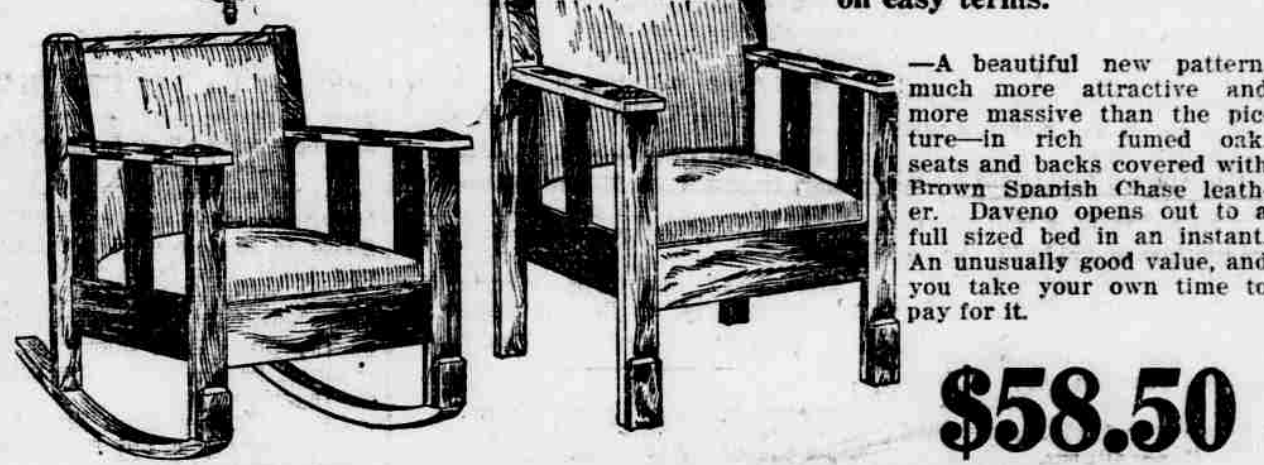

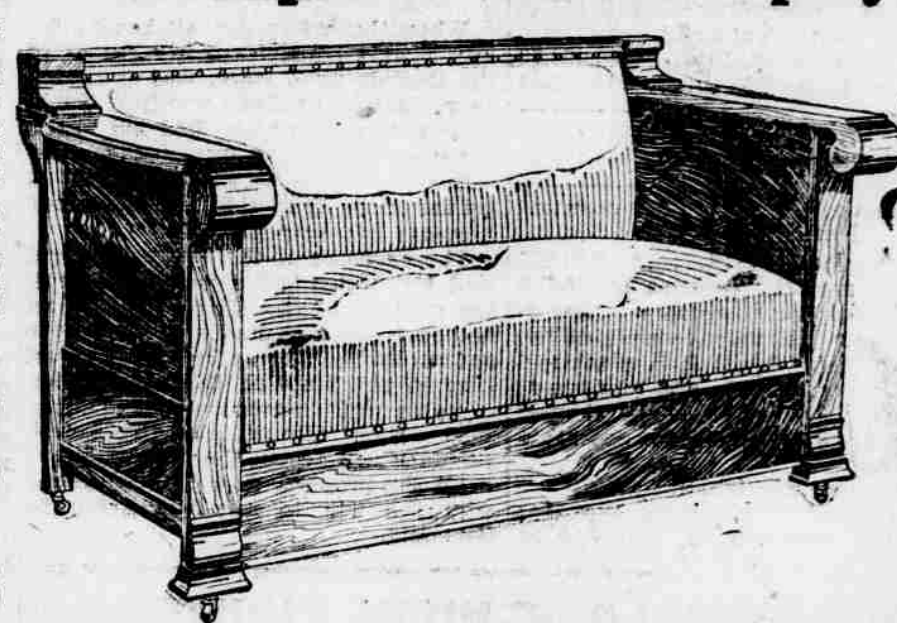
