DOWNTWARD TREND TAKEN BY GRAINS

CHICAGO, March 8.—Wheat prices tended downward today swing largely to the unpromising outlook for a removal of shipping difficulties. The fact at cancellations of export purchases were due to inability to move domestic wheat had a discouraging effect on the bulls. In this connection, it was asserted that a single railroad had 4,500 cars filled with freight standing in the Kansas City yards. Opening prices, which ranged from $\frac{1}{4}$ cent decline to $\frac{1}{4}$ cent advance with May at \$1.87 and July at \$1.87 to \$1.87 were followed by material set backs all around but then a fair reaction.
