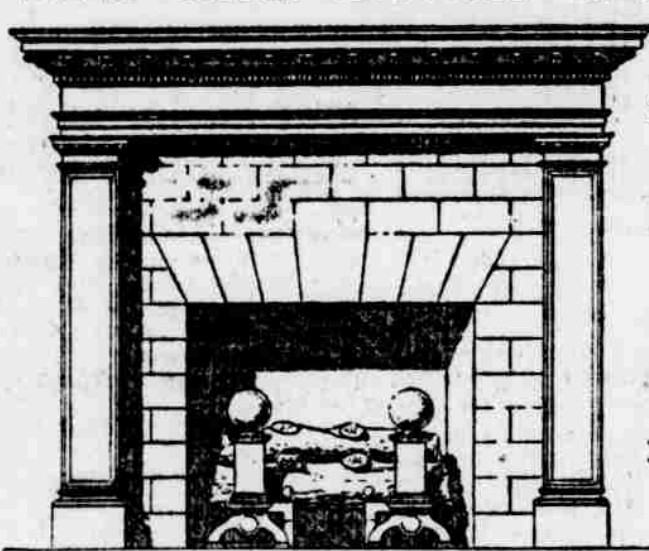

The house is built of dark brick. A garage conforming to the general design of the house is built adjoining the residence at the rear. Passage-ways lead to the garage out of the basement of the residence and out of the kitchen.

The interior of the house is finished in quarter-sawn oak. There are eight rooms and a bath. The basement extends under the entire house.

Every room is equipped with the indirect electric lighting system. Richmond Electric company did the wiring and furnished fixtures.

The hot water heating system is used.

## Living Room is Large.

A large living room, 15x34½ feet extends across the entire first floor of the home.

The house is one of the few in town equipped with a built-in vacuum cleaning system.
