

DEMOCRATS' GUNS SPIKED BY NOTE BOOSTING GRAY

Poundstone Says Republicans Are Amused by Publication of Korbly Letter.

WASHINGTON, July 9.—Ever since the recent election of Richard N. Elliott, Republican candidate for representative in congress from the Sixth Indiana District, administration leaders in congress have been busily explaining that Mr. Elliott's victory was due entirely to the personal unpopularity of the Democratic candidate, Finly H. Gray.

Some explanation had to be made by the administration leaders, for the election in the Sixth Indiana district attracted the attention of the entire nation, it being the first opportunity for any voters in the Central West to express themselves since the general election last November.

Put Blame on Finly.
Therefore the Democratic chiefs in Washington decided to place the entire blame for the Democratic defeat in Indiana on the shoulders of Mr. Gray, and they were quite busy doing this until a day or two ago, when an embarrassing situation arose which had the effect of completely silencing them—a situation which was as amusing to the Republican leaders as it was distasteful to the Democratic managers.

The situation in question arose when a copy of a letter written by Bernard Korbly, Democratic chairman of Indiana, during the recent campaign was made public.

In this letter, which was sent broadcast through the district, Korbly called upon the voters to support Mr. Gray, concluding it with the statement that the election of Mr. Elliott would be regarded, all over the United States, as a "repudiation of President Wilson and his policies."

Guns Are Spiked.
So the talk of the Democratic leaders that Mr. Elliott's election was entirely due to the dissatisfaction of the voters with Gray's record in congress has ceased now, and no further Democratic explanations to advance. Mr. Korbly has spiked their guns, and Mr. Korbly would not be the least bit flattered if he could hear what some of the administration chiefs are saying about him.

The New York American, a Hearst publication, has editorially interpreted the result of the election in the Sixth Indiana district as a repudiation of President Wilson and Wilsonian policies. This publication declares that Mr. Wilson has been "weighed in the balance and found wanting" by the Sixth District voters.
