

## HANDLEY MAY DRILL MILITIA

Lawrence A. Handley, cashier of the German-American bank, will be asked to serve as drill-master of the two units of the state militia to be organized in Richmond, Frank Benn, Wayne county organizer, said Thursday.

Handley has not decided whether he will accept the appointment, and claims that some one with a knowledge of military training should be appointed.

Organizer Benn said that the two units will probably be organized in Richmond within three weeks, if the men between the ages of 18 and 21 respond as they should. Another company of men between the ages of 21 and 41 will also be organized.

Two companies will be organized outside Richmond within two weeks, one at Cambridge City and one at Economy.

A unit will be composed of fifty men and three officers. The companies will be sworn into state service as soon as they are organized. They will not be compelled to go out of the state.
