

## START TO PUT UP 150 TENTS AT CHAUTAUQUA

Workers Arrive to Erect Canvas Homes—Season Tickets Changed.

With all of the first consignment of 150 tents for the 1917 Chautauqua camp sold, Secretary Wissler, announced Thursday that arrangements had been made to get a shipment of tents from the Miami Valley chautauqua to make up any further demand that might be made for tents.

The first allotment of tents were sold much sooner than they have been in other years, and as it is impossible to make any new tents, the directors of the chautauqua expected some difficulty in obtaining an additional number. The Miami Valley association agreed to furnish what tents are needed and there will be ready for use by

the opening of the program on August 19.

### Start on Tents.

All of the floors for tents have been built and the first shipment of tents was received Wednesday. Workmen from the tent company in Dayton arrived Wednesday night and began erecting the tents Thursday.

One of the features of the camp this year will be the Red Cross tent. Through the Red Cross society, a Red Cross "first aid" tent will be centrally located within the Chautauqua grounds and here persons who become ill while on the grounds, or who are injured may receive attention.

A representative of the Red Cross society, who will be in charge of the tent, will also have literature and specimens of the work done at the headquarters of the Richmond chapter and will explain the work of the society.

Many organizations of the city have arranged to have tents at the camp, and will maintain headquarters there.

### Change Made In Form.

Season tickets, which have been on sale at downtown stores for the last week, are being sold rapidly, and the directors are confident that the required number of guarantee tickets will be sold before the opening of the assembly. A change has been made in the form of the season tickets this year.
