

QUAKERS OBJECT TO DRILL WORK AT CAMP TAYLOR

Members of Church Say They Will Die Before They Will Fight.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Sept. 28.—Camp Taylor became a hotbed of war interest today when Mennonites and Quakers among the selected men declared they would submit to imprisonment and even to death before they will fight.

When orders were issued today for the daily drill work, members of these two religious sects refused to appear and declared their intention to resist any effort to compel them to fight.

Pending settlement of the trouble, officers immediately assigned the men to work of handling coal and service in the camp kitchens.

Leaders of the protesting soldiers announced their intention to appeal to Secretary of War Baker and a report of the trouble also has been forwarded to the war department by the camp officials.

How many of the protesting soldiers are from Indianapolis is unknown, but it is known some of them were sent to Camp Taylor from cities in Indiana.

The "religious" problem is only one of the questions confronting the officers in charge of the camp. A great number of aliens are in camp and it is doubtful whether some can be compelled to serve. The state department at Washington has urged the various state boards to be careful in ordering aliens into service when they have not declared their intention to become citizens.

The Indiana boys in camp are proving that Hoosier wit and wisdom extends to army service as well as to the arts of the pen.

Purchase of 200 acres of land for an addition to Camp Zachary Taylor has been announced. Barracks for the accommodation of an additional 8,000 men will be erected at once.


CROW IN PUBLIC EYE




