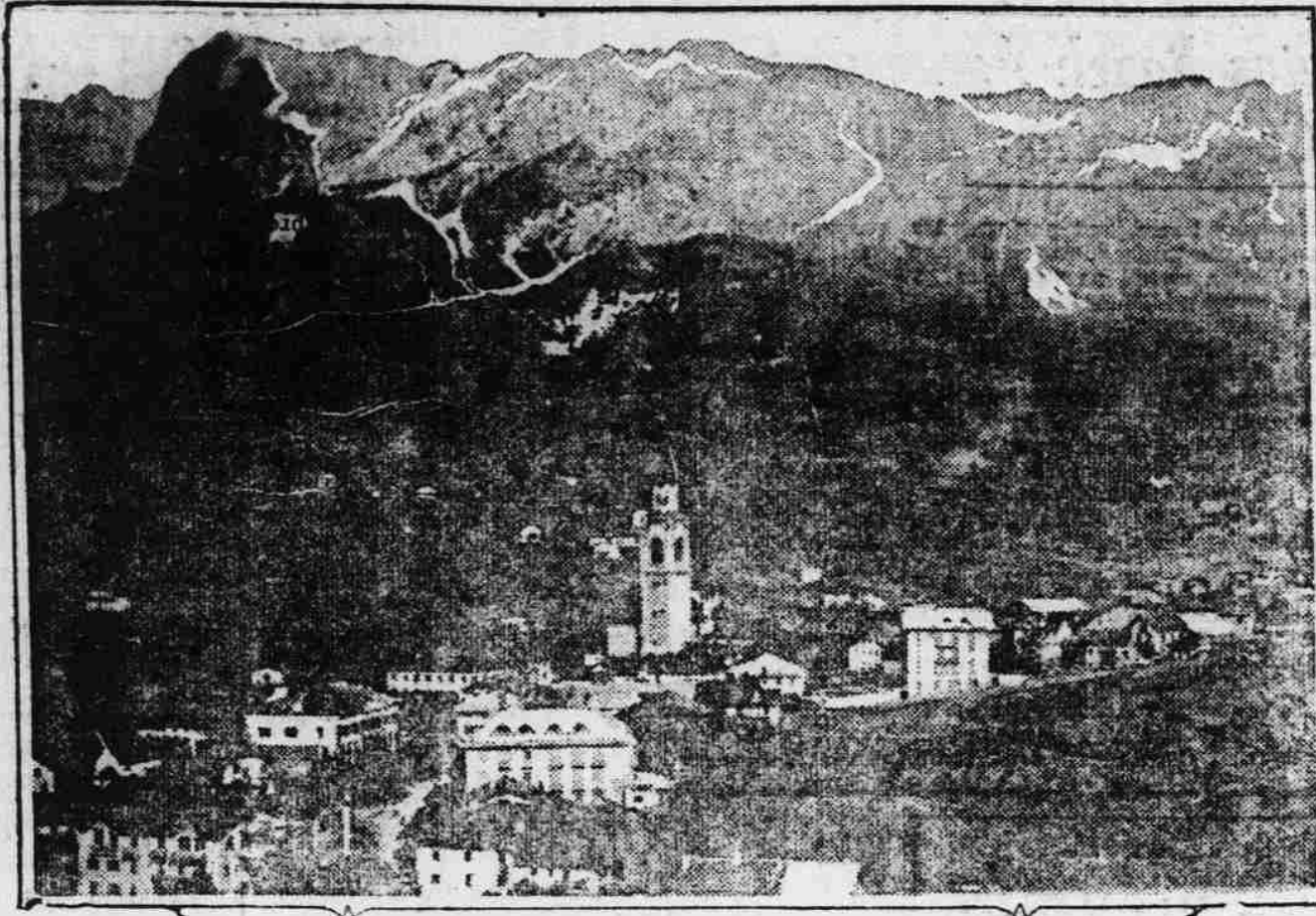

Mrs. Joseph Bremer was burned seriously about the face and body. Eight families are homeless. Those on the upper floors escaped with only the clothes they had on. The loss is estimated at \$10,000.

RUSS BEAT TURKS

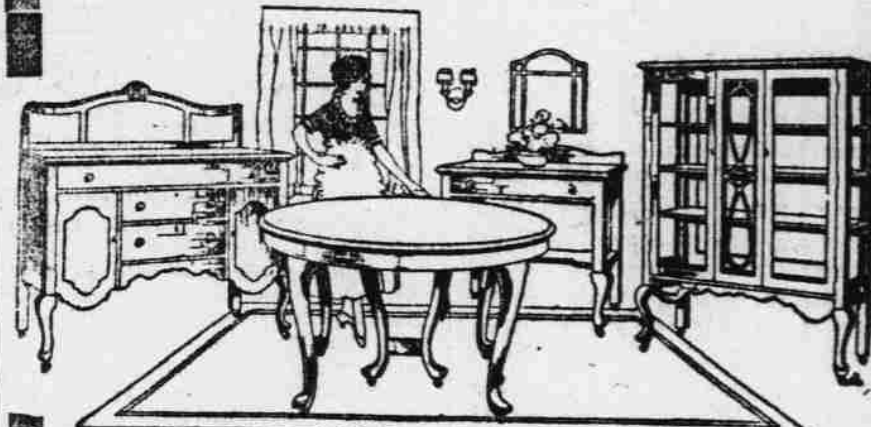

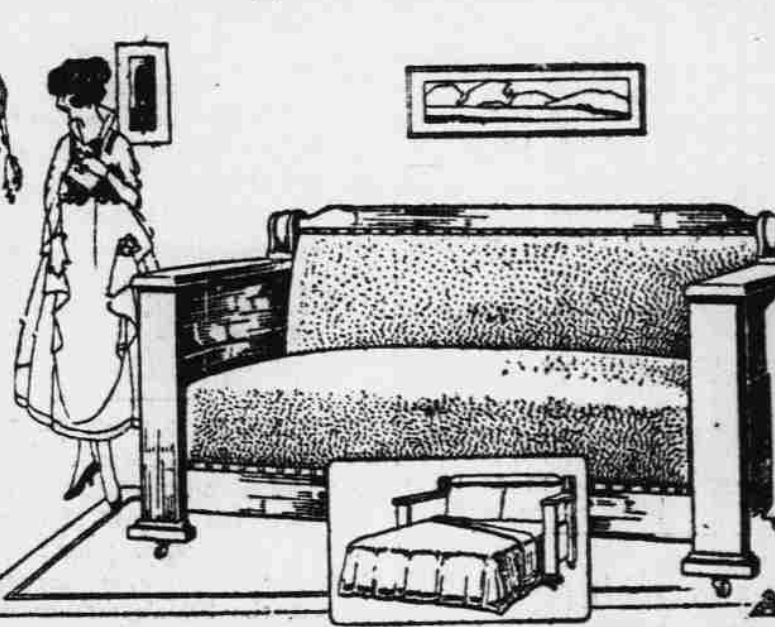
