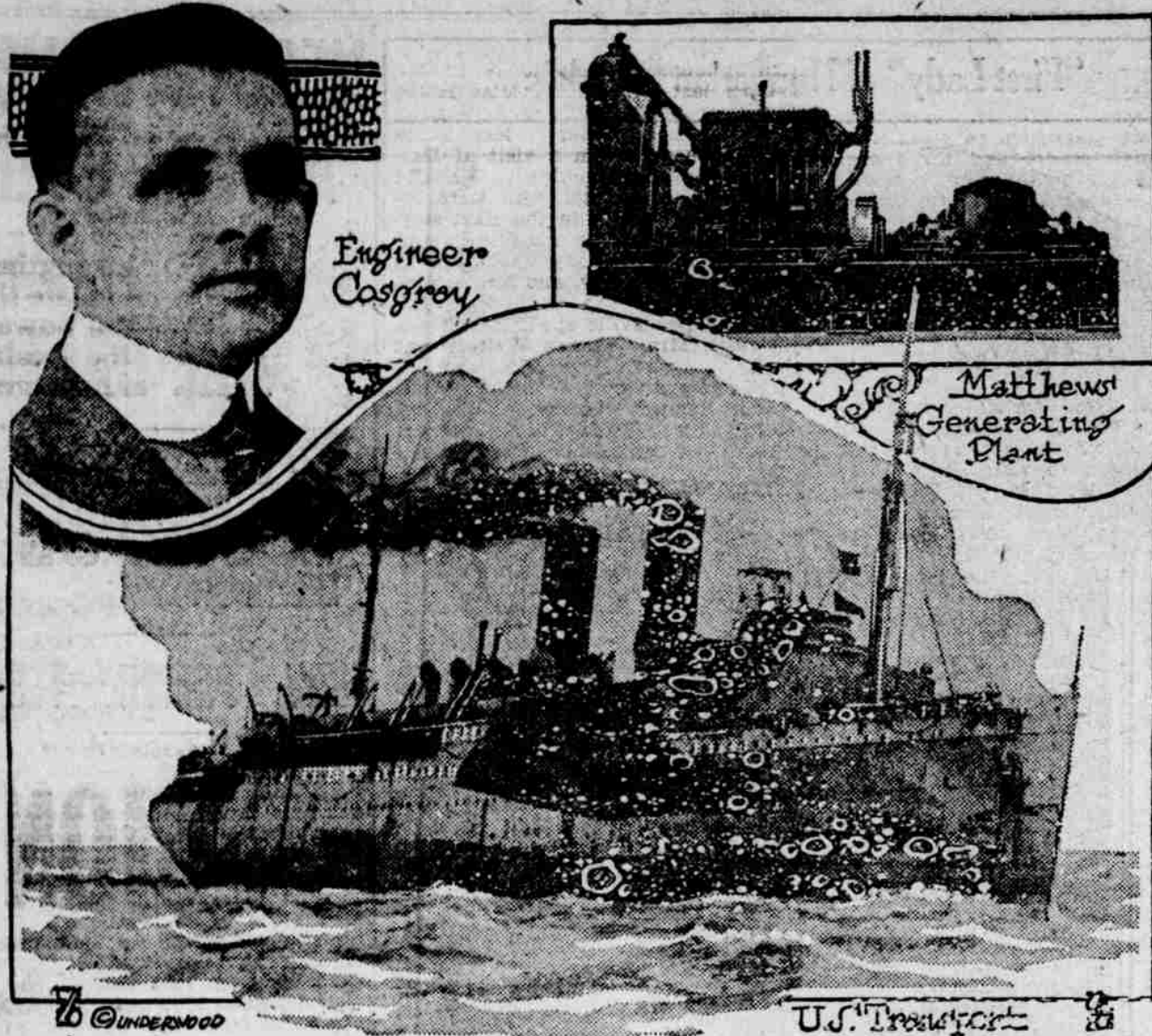


JUICE THAT GUARDED DOUGHBOY PROMISES NEW ERA ON FARM



To defeat German plans for "traceless sinking," provision was made for a small auxiliary electric plant on the deck of every U. S. transport, with an automatic switch-board that brought it into play whenever the principal generating plant was crippled. It was to keep the lights burning and the wireless telegraph calling for help so long as any part of the hull remained above water.

Casgray of the Matthews Engineering Co., Sandusky, who solved the electrical features of the problem, says that the same principle which operated to "cut in" the auxiliary plant without loss of a dot or dash in the wireless message, also solves the problem of continuous electrical current for suburban homes, without requiring that the owner so much as press a button.

When stored electric current fell below a certain point, the engine was automatically started and ran until the current was restored. The gentle Hun art of "spurious versankte," or traceless sinking, consisted in directing an attack at night upon the engine room of the doomed vessel. It was riddled with shells or split open with a torpedo, so as to silence the wireless and leave the sinking ship in darkness. Hence the "farm" plant on the deck of the transport constituted the doughboy's last link with his rescuer. No less than 125 such plants were built in Sandusky for the government.

YANKEE ENGINEERS ACTIVE IN RUSSIA

WITH THE AMERICAN TROOPS IN NORTH RUSSIA, March 7.—Beginning at Archangel and extending to the furthest point south in the forests where the North Russian expeditionary force is operating against the Bolsheviks, the work of the American engineer is evident.

They went into almost impassable swamps in the early autumn and built roads, blockhouses, barracks and bridges, to say nothing of a corduroy road or a railroad switch track now and then. In the dead of winter, when the thermometer had gone far below zero they have done the same thing in the snow.

Fortunately for the engineers, their most needed supply, wood, has been cut close at hand. The British officers commanding the expedition have never ceased to praise the speed with which these American engineers have frequently gone into a forest and transformed some of its trees into livable barracks or blockhouses within a couple of days' time.

The country through which the allied and Russian troops are operating is, for the most part, very sparsely settled. At some points, the American engineers have doubled the existing number of houses in a village. They have built and are still building.

One of their jobs on the Volofda railroad sector of the front has been to transform rough little Russian box cars into habitations for troops. They are doubled-walled them against the cold, and in a company train one can find bath cars, kitchens, offices, dormitory cars, hospitals and nearly every kind of a commissary store or canteen, all built from box cars and for the most part lighted by electricity.

Col. Frederick M. Wise, the man who led the Second battalion, Fifth Marines, in the memorable battle of Chateau-Thierry, has arrived in this country with his wife. It was Colonel Wise who remarked, when ordered to retreat, "To hell with retreating, let the Germans do that." His battalion captured 500 Germans and many machine guns at a cost of a 75 per cent casualty list between June 2 and June 5.

FOOD WILL COMBAT BOLSHIEVISM IN RUMANIA, DECLARES QUEEN MARIE

PARIS, March 7.—Queen Marie of Rumania declared today, that in spite of the plight of her country and the sufferings of the people in the war, there is not danger of Bolshevism there if supplies of food can be secured. Speaking of conditions in Rumania during the war the queen said: "We suffered even worse than did Belgium. She had England and France by her side and behind them stood America, while we had only Russia to depend upon. When the Russians came to assist us, all they did was to eat our food. They were never of any real aid. German plotters saw to that, and when Russia broke, we were absolutely isolated."

"I have no fear of Bolshevism if food is provided immediately. We are used to being shabby and can go with-

out clothes and shoes, but must have food. It is very difficult to distribute food in my country because of the wholesale destruction of railways and the theft of locomotives, cars and horses. We have no iron to rebuild ruined bridges, but are using wood to repair these structures. The imperative need is locomotives. Our oil

fields are producing oil for engines and for export, but we have no means of moving it.

"Hunger produces revolutions and Bolshevism. The Bolsheviks are cowards. They will not stand before an organized force. We do not fear them and they have failed in their efforts to ruin Rumania. I have gone about in perfect safety in my war work."

Queen Marie expressed deep appreciation of the work done by the American Red Cross. Thousands of Americans tried to assist Rumania by sending supplies monthly to that country by way of Russia, but the queen said that the most of them never reached their intended destination. She will confer with Herbert Hoover, chairman of the supreme food council tomorrow and expressed confidence that the council will aid Rumania.

The queen called attention to the French war cross, with a palm which she wears.

"I was given that cross by the government," she said, "because officials said I was a good soldier. I prize it more highly than any decoration I have."

Queen Marie, whose beauty enhances the charm of her forceful personality, received callers today in a room filled with gifts of flowers from representatives of the entente nations.

Dog Teams Carry Wounded Men from Siberian Front

LONDON, March 7.—Allied soldiers who are wounded in the fighting along the Murman coast front are cared for most efficiently, according to a Reuters dispatch. Dog teams and reindeer are used to take the wounded men from the front to Kem, where they are placed on a train which takes them to Murmansk. After their arrival at Murmansk they are distributed to medical aid posts scattered over the country in farm houses and in tents. Before being taken to the rail head the wounded men are placed on deep skin bags and have hot water bottles placed around them. These

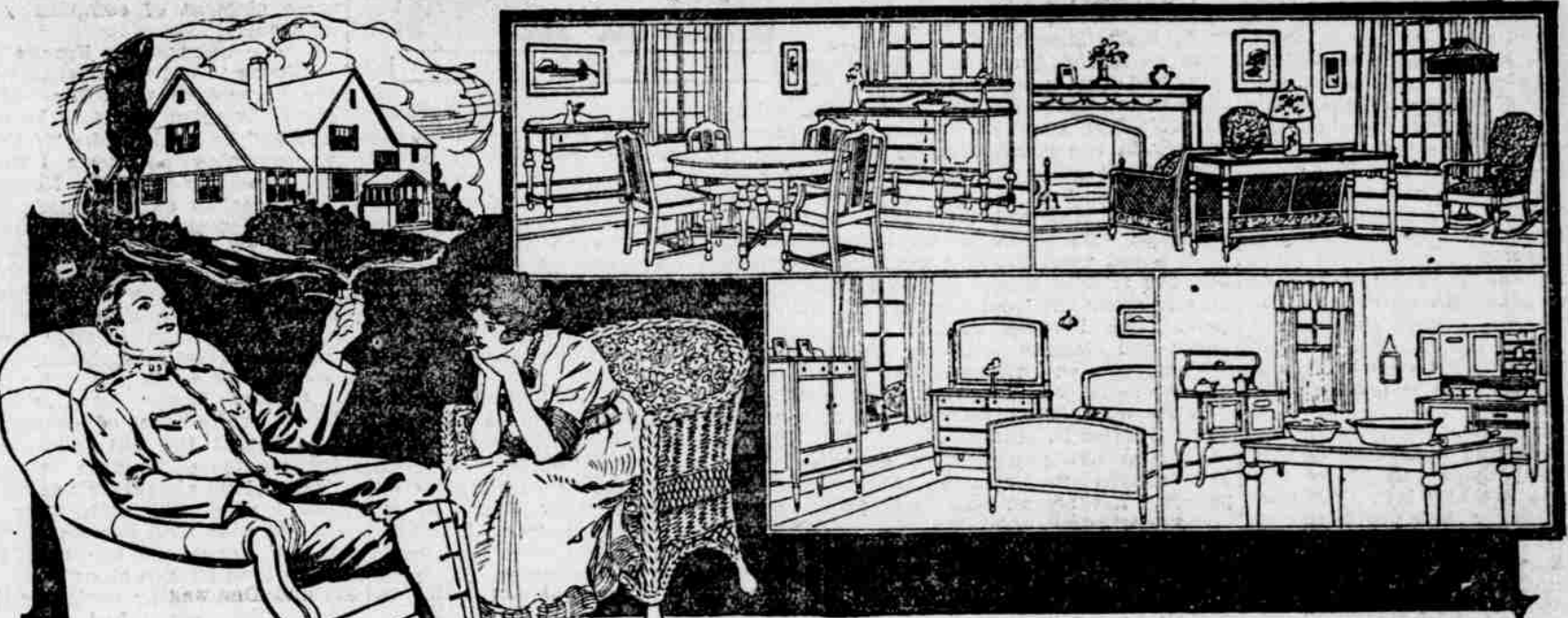

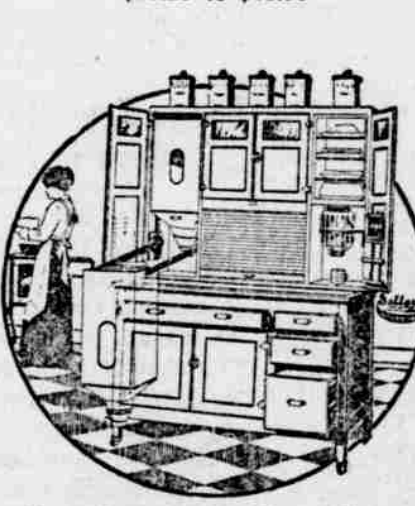
