Corn belt: needs rain and there is moisture in the forecast. Absence of hot weather has hurt the buying side. European crops very poor but indications are they will squeeze through the best possible. Some locals are quite bearish on the cost of living but the majority look for rallies. Financial arrangements of railway trouble may force dull export situation.
