Although no freight is being received for shipment at the local office of the C. & O. railroad, through freight service as well as local freight service was resumed on the C. & O. lines Thursday morning.

Officials of the company announced Thursday that freight would be received for shipment at the local freight house within the next few days.

All of the striking employees at the Boston yards returned to their work Wednesday night or Thursday morning, and passenger service was resumed in full Thursday.

Two trains in each direction are now scheduled on the C. & O. lines. Trains No. 2 and 3 were added to the schedule Thursday. Train No. 2 leaves here at 7:57 a. m. for Cincinnati, and the other leaves at 8:40 p. m., for Chicago.

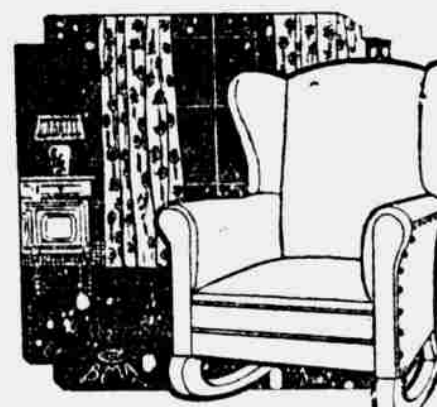

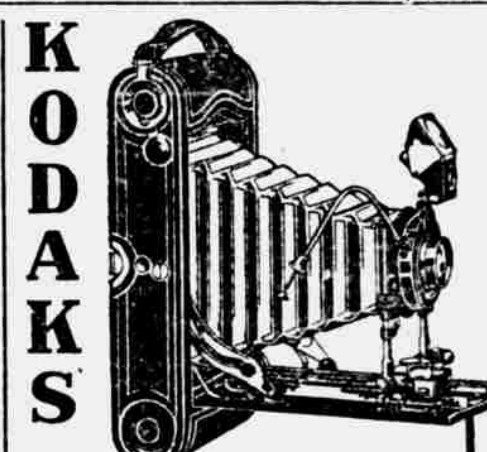
