There will be street fair display worth while and seats are to be erected along the sidewalks where horse, cattle and other exhibits are to be paraded. The evening shows will be especially interesting. Mr. B. F. Parsons advises that you do not miss the decorated auto parade on Thursday, Richmond day, at 2:30. The prizes are: first \$25; second, \$15; third, \$10. A Newcastle man says he is going to win first prize if it costs him \$100 to decorate his machine. There will be two bands in town on Thursday, the Richmond and the Indianapolis Newsboys' bands.

Comic Dress Parade Friday Night

A heap of fun is expected on Friday night when the comic dress parade gets into action. Not only will the Hagerstown folks take part in this but many others from miles around. Those hoping not only to have a lot of fun, but to also win prize money, are registering with Edgar Locke, who is in charge of this parade.

Fly, If You Care To
The Chenoweth company of Richmond has contracted to supply the overhead entertainment daily. If you care to fly you will have to do so before 11 o'clock, for the rest of the daylight hours will be devoted to exhibition flying by Lieut. Edward Rodefeld in the latest design in Curtis passenger airplanes, just newly purchased.

The street fair arrangements were made with a first class traveling organization, so

it is claimed, and the various features are designed to be most entertaining.

With reference to the general line of exhibits all will be properly housed and cared for. A change has been made in the original horse show program, providing that some of each class of horses will be shown each day for the benefit of those who have but one day to spend at the fair. The Indianapolis Newsboys' band will provide the music from Wednesday on, assisted by the Richmond band on Thursday, with Newcastle heading the musical program on Wednesday, Newcastle day.

The Women's Department

If we have so far omitted mention of the Women's Department of the show you may be sure that the committee has not overlooked that important feature of every county fair. Mrs. T. S. Walker is in charge of this department in which numerous premiums are offered. Premiums will be given in the arts and crafts section for embroidery, camera work, drawing, china painting, etc. Mrs. Frank M. Whitesell, president of the Garden Club, is in charge of the exhibits in this line, which are to include fruits and flowers.

So far as the big money premiums go the horse show is the nine-time winner. There are \$100 cash premiums or prizes to be awarded in the various classes, besides ribbons enough to encircle the town and ribbons cost money nowadays.

Now have the cattle interests been the least bit slighted or overlooked. A lot of purses have been "hung up" for cattle exhibits, calf clubs, and for the exhibition of hogs. It will also take a cash drawer full of money to pay the poultry awards, the premium list covering every class of bird on which awards are made at the largest,

first class shows. No entry fee is to be charged in this department, but ten per cent will be deducted from all winnings.

Choice Poultry Exhibit

If you have something good to show in the poultry line bring it in. As they say in Boston, "you are cordially invited" to do so, with the assurance that your birds will be properly housed and cared for. Talk it over with Albert Gordon, superintendent of the poultry section, quickly, for entries must all be made by Monday noon, though the birds need not be displayed until Tuesday. It is important that all the space be allotted early to insure room and proper classification.

Don't Miss the Auto Parade

The great American hen is no longer a side issue. So far as many farm wives are concerned, the poultry yard is the whole works, when it comes to supplying her with pin money when marketing. We can't have too many chickens, and few of us have ever had enough of them in the icebox. Patronize the poultry show and then go home, determined to raise more chickens and to produce more eggs, for heaven knows we need them, and if at a little less money they will be more than ever welcome. People who raise poultry, and who give the birds the care and attention they are entitled to, are public benefactors and are on the highway to fortune at sixty miles an hour.
