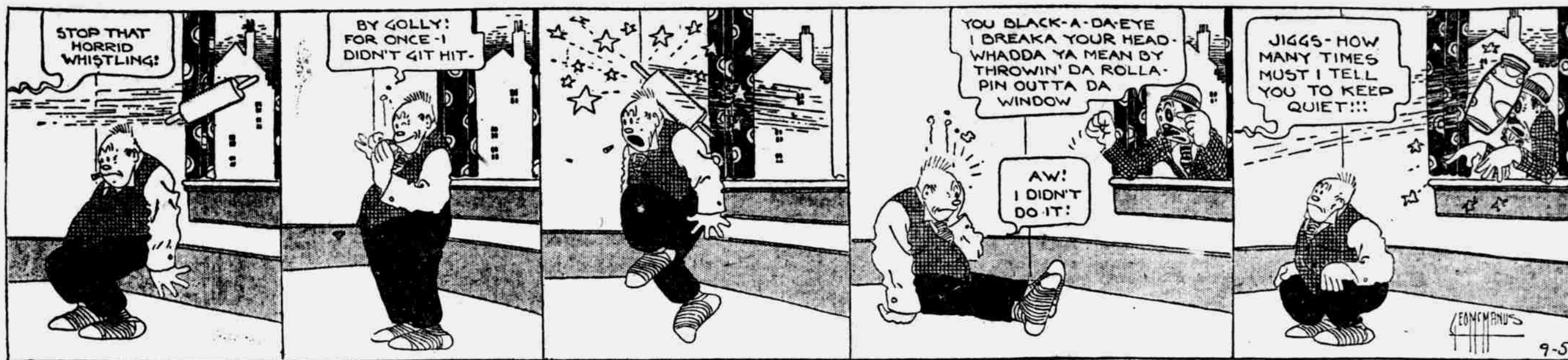

May it yet be possible to do long range weather forecasting on the earth by studying the waxing and waning of the ice cap on the South Pole of Mars?

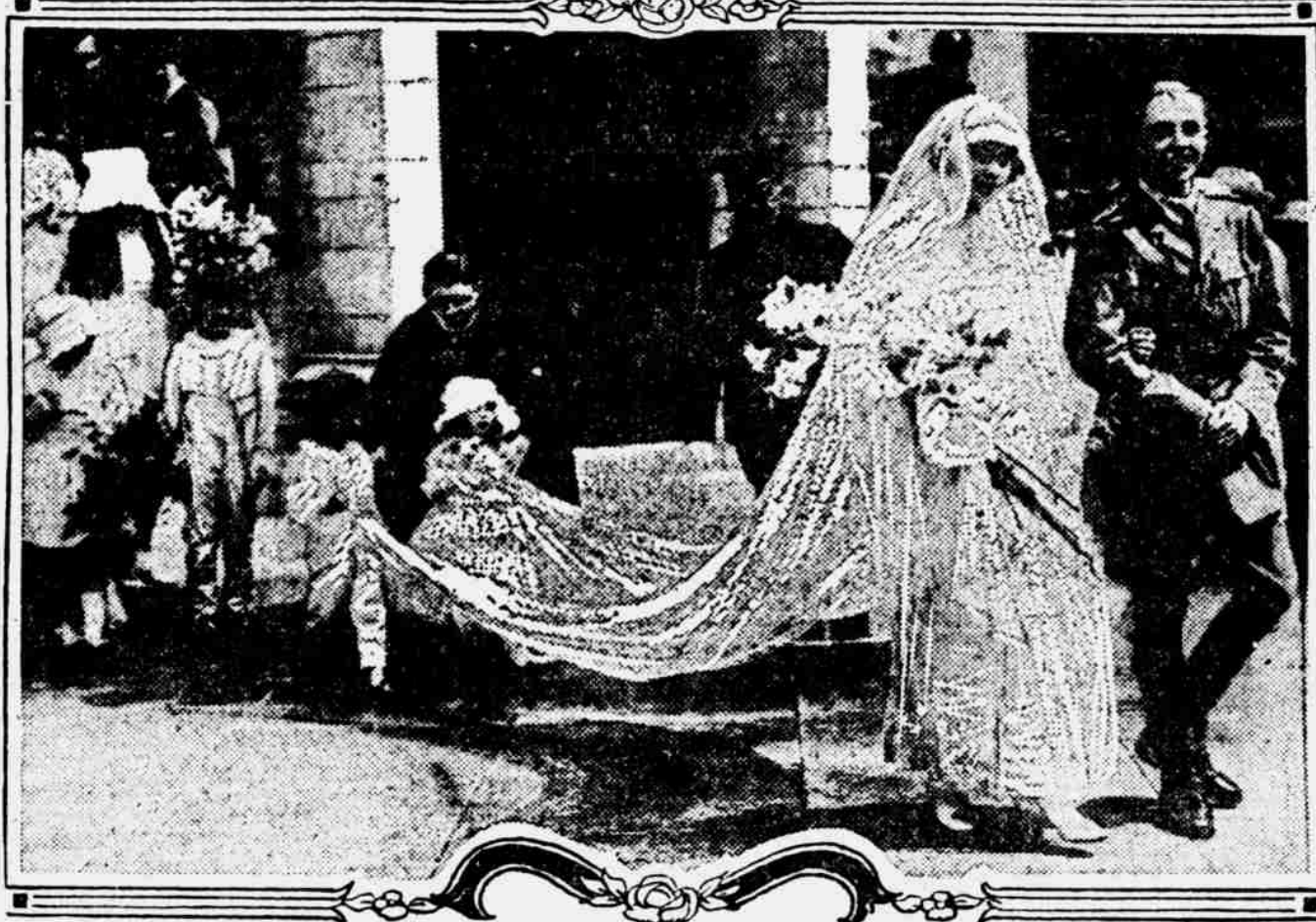
## Big Raccoon Disposes Of Many Chickens
