

# GOODRICH FLAYS INTERNATIONAL IN ALBANY TALK

Deadliest Foe of American Constitution is International Socialism, Says Governor.

ALBANY, N. Y., Sept. 18.—In a remarkably able address dealing with the inception of the American constitution down to the present day, Governor James P. Goodrich of Indiana, here Wednesday night, speaking under the auspices of the National Security league at the State Educational building, warned his audience of the aspirations of the international Socialist movement which, he declared, had for its purpose the overthrow of the American constitution as an outworn, archaic instrument and the substitution in its place of what he called "the rule of the mob." The meeting was held as a part of the nationwide campaign to foster interest in the constitution.

After reviewing the early trials of the founders of the American republic and the evolution of the United States under a constitution, taking the place of the loose confederation which at first bound the states together, he declared that the constitution had served to carry the nation through many a storm; that it had been tried and not found wanting. Despite the assurances of liberty continued in it, the governor declared, there had now appeared a menacing movement which openly announced its contempt for the venerable document and would cast it overboard. Touching on this point, he said:

**Danger Appears Again.**  
"Strange to say, the very first assaults made against the constitution were upon the spirit of nationalism which it breathed and by the men who were unable to see beyond the boundaries of their own states. This assault developed into the great struggle over sectionalism, and a construction of our constitution which was not abandoned until four years of civil war."

"How I wish I might tell you that the defeat of sectionalism marked the end of the struggle against American nationalism! But we are in danger again, this time from a foe more deadly, because it is insidious. It comes not as a warrior to break up our constitutional government by depriving it of some of its fairest states through force of arms, but as a wolf in sheep's clothing to dissolve the fabric by cunning and by fraud; as a false prophet, proclaiming a government that is fairer than this in which we may avoid the toll and sacrifice that have always been necessary to any true advancement."

"And the name of this danger is not sectionalism, but internationalism, a doctrine which teaches that the flag is not a symbol of liberty but an emblem of the obsolete—standing for a time when all men were slaves."
