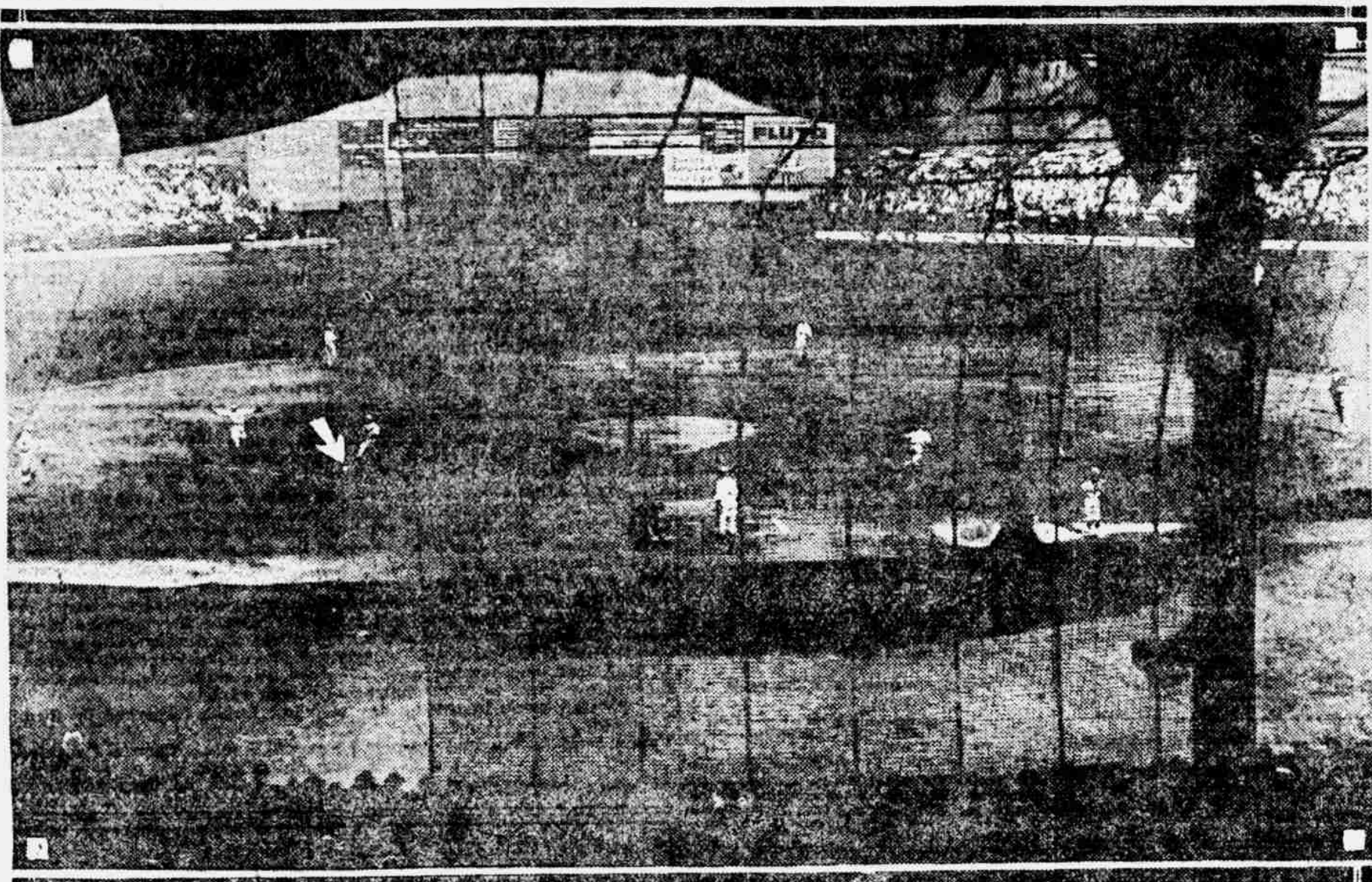


WHILE SOX WERE BEATING REDS IN FIRST GAME AT CHICAGO

GAMBLING MUST STOP AT MIAMI SAYS PRESIDENT

University Head Scores Gambling Among Students—Form Legion.

OXFORD, O., Oct. 7.—President R. M. Hughes, of Miami University, yesterday gave the men of the institution a call down on gambling. Ever since the S. T. C. of last year there has been a large amount of craps-shooting and betting. One student who could afford it lost \$20 on the world's series a few days ago, and President Hughes heard about it. He says the practice must stop; that they have no right to gamble away their parents' money. Also he called attention to the moral side of the question.

Extensive arrangements are being made at Miami University for the annual home-coming of the alumni, which will take place on Saturday, October 18. Miami's football team will play Ohio Wesleyan University here on that day, and it is expected that 400 to 500 graduates and former students will be here.

Organize Post. Two hundred Miami students who were in the national service during the recent war are organizing a post of the American Legion. The post will be named after Dillon Watterson, of Kallida, who was killed in the Chateau Thierry battle on July 15, 1918, and was the only Miami boy who actually died in action.

Claims Against Carranza To Be Only \$25,000,000

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—Damage claims against the Carranza government in Mexico will not amount to more than \$25,000,000, the senate subcommittee investigating Mexican conditions was told Monday by Thomas R. Lill, one of the group of American accountants employed by President Carranza to install an efficiency system for his administration.

Mr. Lill referred to a Supreme Court decision to support his own opinion that damages sustained by foreigners in regions controlled by various rebel bands could not be charged to the Carranza government.

He was doubtful if claims presented for damages incurred during the Huerta administration could be collected from the present government, since Huerta never was recognized by the United States.

The estimate of \$25,000,000 was based, Mr. Lill said, on claims made after revolutions between 1923 and 1925. Mr. Lill said he was convinced that a large part of the funds handled by Huerta were "tainted with fraud." He cited the payment of 20,000,000 pesos to John W. Dekey, President of the National Packing company of Mexico, yesterday.



Garfield Wins From Senior High School in Tennis Matches

Earl Thomas won the singles tennis championship of the Garfield Junior High School by winning three out of four sets from William Brady at the playgrounds, Monday afternoon. Brady gave Thomas quite a tussle in the first set, but Thomas finally won, 6-4. Brady took a brace and captured the second after a hard struggle, 7-5, but after that he could not keep up the pace and dropped the last two, 6-3 and 6-2.

Other results of the tournament starting with the first match were: Thomas-Kessler, 6-0, 6-1; Powell-Everman, 6-1, 6-3; Arnold-Jessup, 7-5, 6-1; Brady-Thomas, 6-3, 6-4; Thomas-Powell, 7-5, 8-6; Brady-Arnold, 6-0, 6-1; Thomas-Brady, 6-1, 5-7, 6-3, 6-2.

In an exhibition match with the High School, at the playgrounds, Saturday morning, Garfield won the singles, but dropped the doubles. Keith King and Robert Hawekotte represented the High School while Earl Thomas defended Garfield.

In the singles, Thomas won two straight sets from King, beating him a love set in the first match and winning the second, 6-1. Powell had more difficulty in defeating Hawekotte, but won in two straight sets, 6-4 and 6-3.

In the doubles, Thomas and Powell won the first match from King and Hawekotte, 6-4, but dropped the next two sets by the same score, 6-4, 6-4.

Thomas and Powell will be awarded the Garfield "G" for playing the High School representatives.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Oct. 7.—With the world's football tide decided this week, the eyes of Hoosier sport lovers will turn to the state football classic which will be staged at Indianapolis Saturday, October 18, between the universities of Indiana and Minnesota. HITCHCOCK STARTS TREATY SQUABBLE

(By Associated Press)

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—The senate jumped into a discussion of the peace treaty two hours ahead of its schedule. When the session began, Senator Hitchcock, of Nebraska, leader of the administration forces, of the Los Angeles branch of the League to Enforce Peace, saying among other things that "the people of California were overwhelmingly in favor of the league."

References in the telegram to Senator Johnson, Republican, drew sharp comment from Senator Borah, Republican, Idaho.

"Maybe the senator from California will be able to recoup his Republican losses in California by Democratic gains in Massachusetts," said Senator Borah, in asking that the platform adopted by the Democrats of Massachusetts, opposing the league covenant as framed, be put into the record.

"Why not insert the platform adopted by the Massachusetts Republicans, which might throw light on this subject?" said Senator Nelson, Republican, Minnesota.

Senator Borah did so, and added that notwithstanding the president's wish, there seemed danger of getting the league into every political arena. Senator Hitchcock declared that in presenting the telegram it was not his purpose to show that Senator

Johnson had lost personal following, but that Republicans of high standing and of every calling, of California and some of the senator's former campaign managers, repudiated Senator Johnson's action on the league of nations.
